We need to find a way forward, and as such CFU will continue to work for unity amongst all farmers, both farming and non farming.

I thank everyone that attended the EGM. The support we have received for the proposed way forward has been overwhelming. Constitutions, Policy Documents, Mission statements etc are fine, but it is the implementation of them that counts. The new structures should ensure full transparency and accountability.

My prayer is that we will be able to get compensation for all in the near future. It may be a dream at this stage, but if we do not drive it will remain a dream and not become a reality for many years to come.

At the same time I am really excited about the way forward for those that want to farm. We may be disillusioned and tired, but our children have the energy we all had many years ago when we too faced huge obstacles during the war. I believe that with perseverance, standing up for our rights and principles, and in submission to God, we will succeed.

2011 lies ahead with all its challenges. Let's have a good rest over the next few weeks and come prepared for whatever might come our way.

When reflecting back, although we are still unable to reach our intended goals, due to circumstances far beyond our control we can honestly say that we have made very significant steps in the right direction. We can only pray that the logjam will be broken during the coming year as the groundwork has been carefully laid out and almost completed. This does not mean however that you team will merely be laying back and waiting for events which will change our future to just come about as there is still a huge amount of hard work and lobbying to be done on your behalf in the coming year to ensure our success.

If any of you have not seen the CD which we have produced on the way forward please contact us for a copy or have it saved on your memory stick as we would love to hear your views on it as well as encouraging as many people to see it as possible. We are currently working on a written document which would adequately explain what is projected in the film which will be distributed as soon as it is completed.

Our legal team are still mulling over and studying the judgment on the CFU application for a moratorium on continued land acquisition, prosecution and eviction of farmers but we are very confident that their subsequent advice will be both worthwhile and very significant indeed. Although we have our own positive views on the unfortunate judgment we remain guided by our learned counsel.

Over the last week there have been no significant problems or events occurring and we can only pray that the situation remains the same for an extended period, or at least over the holiday period. Many of us will be travelling over the holiday period and we will obviously encounter many Police roadblocks along our journeys as the authorities do their best to stop the carnage on our roads during the holiday period. Although it has been publicly documented that the commencement date of SI 154/2010 has been amended from 1 December 2010 to July 2011, there has still been nothing published in the Government Gazette stating the same. We can only rely on the press article which is copied again below. We therefore suggest that you do make an effort to comply with the section regarding the red reflective triangles.

"Transport, Communication and Infrastructural Development Secretary Mr Partson Mbiriri yesterday said Statutory Instrument 154 on Road Traffic (Construction, Equipment and Use) Regulations remained unchanged except for the effective date.

"I have indicated in two meetings that when Statutory Instrument 154 of 2010 was initially discussed within the ministry, our intention had been to give the motoring public as much as 12 months' notice.

"Regrettably, there were delays in having the Statutory Instrument gazetted resulting in an effective notice period of only three months," said Mr Mbiriri in an interview yesterday.

"Accordingly, it is the ministry's intention to defer the effective date of the Statutory Instrument by another six months so that the motoring public have reasonable time to relate to the Statutory Instrument. The provisions of the Statutory Instrument shall remain the same in toto," he added.

Mr Mbiriri said the regulations had been served to lawyers in the ministry as well as the Attorney-General's Office.

"We are not amending anything but merely deferring the effective date," he said."

Earlier this year legislation did come out which gave us until December 31st 2010 to upgrade our vehicle number plates which were registered under the old system to the new system. Apparently, the authorities are very serious when they state that any vehicles carrying number plates from the old system would be impounded after the said date. In Harare the process is actually quite simple as all you need to do is to obtain the forms from Causeway Post Office, then obtain a Police Clearance from Southerton before returning to Causeway Post Office to complete the process and upon payment of \$160 you will receive your new number plate and registration book immediately. Don't spoil your holiday and get caught out unnecessarily.

We were certainly very pleased to hear that significant rain has finally fallen in some of the drier parts of the country and if the boffins are correct in their prediction for the coming week we are likely to receive good rain right over the whole country. Looking at the weather maps the Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) has at last move down over Zimbabwe. ARAC UPDATE (from the desk of Ben Purcell Gilpin)

A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE !!

As the old year closes and the New Year approaches, it is a good time to take stock of where we have come from and where we are headed. Often times we focus on the outward and the things we observe which are not necessarily within our span of control, frequently we forget just how much we are able to influence simply by our own choices and attitudes. Life is a gift that is daily renewed for each of us and frequently we spend rather too much of our time focused on either the past or the future and miss the prompting to cherish and engage in the present. Sometimes that present is not what we would like to deal with; equally there are times that pass all too quickly.

Two themes that are close at this time of Advent when we prepare for the coming of Christ as a truly vulnerable person in our midst are those of Exile and Exodus: the pain of separation from a cherished home and a homecoming to a promised land. I suspect that most of us who have gone through the upheaval of our lives in Zimbabwe over the past few years will have some understanding of the very real emotions that accompany a journey through these experiences. Journeys are always times of uncertainty, embedded in such periods, is a profound need to trust that we will indeed reach our desired destination.

For some of us the destination seems defined by where we have come from and is perhaps shaped in a desire to return to a state or situation that we recall with a deep sense of loss, perhaps there is still anger at the process that wrought our transition from that time and place. For others perhaps there is the expectation that no wrong will be deemed as righted until certain pre conditions are met, some neither realistic nor attainable; yes for many of us there are so many wrongs that we have experienced we question whether they can ever be righted. Do these anchor us and deprive us of an ability to move on? Are we stuck in a place of pain and unable to let go and find in the changes that now face us fresh challenges that can empower us and restore in us what really makes us human and alive?

Every day we meet people and are called to respond to them in some way that recognizes our universal connectedness. We are challenged to see and develop relationships that are life- giving and sustaining. Sometimes this is difficult but it is a sure route to a fulfilled life, sometimes we focus on what we have lost and not enough on what we still have ...are there people we take for granted ?Do we fail to experience the goodness of others because we blind ourselves with an over emphasis of their faults? I often think about the farm and livelihood that I lost but I rejoice in the treasure I still have... my family! This time of Christmas will indeed be a time when family and its core values are recharged and renewed. As we refocus for a coming year on what's truly important let us dedicate ourselves to values and attitudes that restore hope to those we meet and love. I hope that we will all take time this Christmas to cherish the good and recognise how we can bring the positive into the lives of those around us.

The past year has seen a renewed effort to build bridges with those who have become estranged from the union and a particular effort to explore practical ways to asset our rights in a way that can bring closure to a painful chapter in our country's development. We have much to offer and at the same time our attitude towards ourselves and those around us will I am sure have a profound effect on the outcomes we can anticipate.

I am confident that the team that is here to serve you will return refreshed, focused and determined to work effectively and efficiently to achieve positive change in Zimbabwe. We recognise that what can restore dignity and respect for our constituency is the same entity needed for all the citizens of Zimbabwe: the recognition of and respect for fundamental rights of all people and not simply the appropriation of such by a few. We shall risk, we shall explore and we shall endeavour with determination to end the exclusion and injustice that has deprived us of opportunity and livelihood. We recognise that whilst the past is gone, the present has not delivered justice and prosperity; the future that we create is determined by the incremental commitment that we make each step along the way.

May you experience the true Peace and Joy of rebirth this Christmas wherever you are be it in Exile or Exodus!
