I wish I was able to give you great news about Zimbabwe and to tell you how so much has changed for the better. There are so many people working so hard to effect change and yet the Mugabe regime keeps the lid on the pot firmly.

Despite its much reduced size, the farming community is still suffering at the hands of those determined to deny them their livelihoods. Just a month ago, one of the few remaining farmers was chased off his farm. Here is part of their story as told by Ben Freeth.

“After a softening up process where their farm workers were put into a state of absolute fear, the Government thugs came for the D’s house. On the first night 117 window panes were smashed in their home with rocks after the thugs broke open the security gate. With the family holed up, the Government thugs were kept busy carting off the loot from the farm – fertilizer, maize, welding machines, tools, workshop equipment, crop chemicals and everything that was available. Reports were made to the Police but they refused to arrest anyone. The thugs then broke into the D’s house and took everything from the office – lap tops and all their office equipment. They then threatened to kill D and rape his wife.”


Regrettably, this kind of episode is likely to become more frequent as the next election looms. ZANU pf have always used violent farm takeovers as part of their electioneering process.
