Ejected farmers - easing their burden

We have eased the burden for a number of farmers and their families by making grants to assist them in the hardest of times when they have been forcibly ejected from their farms or required medical assistance. Luke, one of our recipients, has started a small grocery supply business with the grant. He was so grateful for the assistance he received that he wept uncontrollably.



Farm orphans- giving them a chance

We fund a school outside Harare which is populated largely by farm orphans left homeless after the farm evictions. This schooling is giving them a chance they would never have had without your help. We have provided books, desks and chairs and a new water pump amongst other things.

A shot farm worker - a chance to rebuild his life

We have supported farm worker Wesley since he was shot in the leg 2 years ago by the police during a farm takeover. His leg has now healed after a very long time and we have just paid for raised boots to be made for him by a specialist.





Retired penniless farmers - helping them to survive

Many of these former farmers and their wives are now over 70 years old. Some of them live in very dire circumstances. We provide monthly funding for a number of them to continue to receive care and attention in their old age.

The situation is exceptionally challenging. Many relief projects have stopped owing to a lack of available funding so the needless suffering has been exacerbated. The country itself is penniless and struggling to cope. Without your help, these people have no one to turn to.
