IT is hereby notified that the Minister of Labour and Social Services has, in terms of section 80 of the Labour Act [Chapter 28:01], published the Collective Bargaining Agreement set out in the Schedule and registered in terms of section 79 of the Act, which amends the agreement published in Statutory Instrument 323 of 1993.

NATIONAL EMPLOYMENT COUNCIL FOR THE AGRICULTURAL INDUSTRY OF ZIMBABWE

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT: AGRICULTURAL INDUSTRY (AGRO SECTOR WAGES EFFECTIVE 1st JUNE, 2012)

Made and entered into in accordance with the provisions of the Labour Relations Act [Chapter 28:01] between the Zimbabwe Agricultural Employers' Organisation, Zimbabwe Commercial Farmers' Union, Zimbabwe Farmers Union and Employers' representing Agro sector (hereinafter referred to as "the employers"), as the one part, and the General Agriculture and Plantation Workers' Union of Zimbabwe, Horticulture General Agriculture and Plantation Workers' Union of Zimbabwe (hereinafter referred to as the "employees" or "the trade unions"), being parties to the National Employment Council for the Agricultural Industry to amend the principal agreement published in Statutory Instrument 323 of 1993.

Now, therefore, it is recorded that the agreed new wages for Agro sector of Zimbabwe shall be as follows—

The NEC Agriculture comprising the social parties, that is, GAPWUZ and HGAPWUZ on the employees side and ZAEO, ZCFU, ZFU and employers' representing Agro sector on the employers side have agreed on wages of Agro Sector effective 1st June, 2012, as follows:

An employer can apply to the National Employment Council within 14 days for an exemption or partial exemption from paying wages as set up in the above Schedule, stating the reasons why that application should be considered.
