Collective Bargaining Agreement: Tourism Industry

IT is hereby notified that the Minister of Labour and Social Services has, in terms of section 80 of the Labour Act [Chapter 28:01], published the Collective Bargaining Agreement set out in the Schedule after it was registered in terms of section 79 of the Labour Act [Chapter 28:01].

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT: TOURISM INDUSTRY

SALARIES AND WAGES

This agreement made and entered into in accordance with the provisions of the Labour Act [Chapter 28:01] between the Employers Association for Tours and Safari Operators of the Tourism Industry and the Boating Association of Zimbabwe (hereinafter referred to as" "the employer" or "the employers organisation") of the one party and the National Museums, Monuments, Travel, Tourism, Game Parks and Wildlife Workers Union of Zimbabwe and the Zimbabwe Tourism and Allied Workers Union (hereinafter referred to as "the employees" or "the trade unions") of the other party being parties to the National Employment Council for the Tourism Industry (hereinafter referred to as "the council").

This Agreement is endorsed by the employers and employees in the spirit of good faith, and shall be deemed to have come into effect on 1st of October, 2012 and is applicable up to the 28th of February, 2013.

Grade minimums have been agreed for the period and are reflected below. It is further agreed by the council that the basic wage of an employee will exclude any allowances that may be payable to an employee. In addition, it has been agreed by the council that this does not preclude the employer and employees at company Works Council to improve on conditions of service.

Notwithstanding the minimum set out below, no employee in receipt of a wage in excess of the minimum shall have his or her wage reduced.

- (2) A monthly lights allowance shall be \$10 per month where no lighting facilities are provided.
- (3) A cooking fuel allowance shall be \$10 per month where there are no cooking facilities.

Allowances for all sectors

- 3. (1) Where accommodation is not provided directly or indirectly, the monthly allowance shall be \$45.
- (2) Transport allowance shall be \$35 per month where transport has not been provided.

Conversion of rates

4. For the purpose of converting monthly wages to their daily, fortnightly, weekly and hourly equivalents, the following computations shall apply:—

- (1) To obtain the daily rate, the monthly rate shall be divided by 26;
- (2) to obtain the fortnightly rate, the monthly rate should be divided by two and one sixth;
- (3) to obtain the weekly rate, the monthly rate should be divided by four and one third;
- (4) to obtain the hourly rate for Sector I, the daily rate should be divided by eight. To obtain the hourly rate for Sector II the daily rate should be divided by eight and a half:

Provided that calculation for payment in lieu of vacation leave shall be calculated at 2.5 days for every completed month of service.

Council dues

5. For the purposes of meeting the expenses of the council every employer shall each month make a deduction of council dues equivalent to 1.25 percent from basic wages of each of his employees for whom wages are prescribed in this agreement. To the amount so deducted, the employer shall contribute an equivalent amount and shall remit it to council before the sixteenth of the following month.

Declaration

The parties having arrived at the agreement set forth herein, the undersigned officers of the council hereby declare that the foregoing is the agreement arrived at, and affix their signatures hereto.
