FRANCIS MEDICAL SUPPORT FUND

During the course of the past two weeks our farming community have been shocked by the horrific assault and subsequent death of two members of the same family in the Guruve farming area. The elderly father and his young daughter were rushed to hospital in Harare where they spent a week and more in ICU in a coma. They both underwent delicate surgery in an attempt to save their lives but sadly it was all in vain as the injuries were far too great.

The end result of this is that the remaining family members have now been left with the burden of a huge debt of medical aid shortfalls and extra expenses which they simply do not have the funds to pay. There were also no insurance policies to assist.

The President of the Commercial Farmers' Union has therefore decided to send out this desperate appeal for donations to assist this grieving family. He has opened up a separate bank account which will be administered by the CFU all of whose accounts are properly audited every year. This special account will be open for inspection by any interested party on request.

All donations will be used for the following:

- Assist with medical bills;
- Pay funeral and memorial expenses;
- Assist with the relocation of the remaining family members.

Herewith is a hyperlink to the latest copy of the <u>Zambia National Farmers' Union newsletter Number 17 of 2014</u>, which makes very interesting reading as usual.

SECURITY AND LAND

Although a number of incidents have been reported this week we do feel that many cases are still not being reported for a number of reasons.

Although a lot has been said about the reversal of the Indigenisation Policy and BIPPAs we are yet to see anything substantial in the form of Statutory Instruments to repeal and replace existing legislation there it is difficult to advise on those important subjects which are severely restricting investment as well as income generation. The latter is of course the <u>conservancies</u> who have been denied an income for a third season in a row. There have been several high-level meetings on seeking clarification the result of which we eagerly await.

We have recently also seen a few court cases in the lower courts going against farmers where the prosecutors continue to use the controversial judgment of the CFU Supreme Court Case in 2010. Whilst these cases have generally been referred to the higher courts there is great concern that the same precedent may simply be used there too. It is for this very reason that we are again appealing to Government for a moratorium on land acquisition so that those on the land can continue farming and be as productive as possible.

The issue of <u>fake offer letters</u> is starting to be a point of discussion in the press recently and anyone who has any evidence of this occurrence should contact us with their details please.

"A SENSE of déjà vu has engulfed the countryside as a spate of land invasions continue to take place right under the nose of President Robert Mugabe's administration. Nearly 14 years after the first land invasions catapulted Zimbabwe onto the international stage for the wrong reasons — agitation for land by landless blacks is still continuing — with no signs that this could be coming to an end anytime soon."

In the Gazette of 23 May 2014 there was nothing of particular interest to farmers apart for the publication of the new medical rates. In today's newspaper there was no publication of any acquisition notices.

Sugarcane

Production of sugar cane in Zimbabwe is projected to drop by 3% to 3.8 million tonnes this year due to a 12% decline in the area harvested, though the yield per hectare is expected to increase. Cane yield per hectare is expected to increase as good summer rains from December 2013 to March 2014 improved the availability of irrigation water in supply dams. The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization said the scenario would result in sugar output decreasing only marginally to 480 000 tonnes from the 488 000 tonnes produced last year. In the 2012/13 season, Zimbabwe harvested 3.9 million tonnes of sugar cane on 46 605 hectares, marginally less than the 4 million tonnes on 53 486 hectares the 2011/12 season.

Genetically Modified Organisms GMOs

The Deputy Minister of Higher and Tertiary Education, Science and Technology Development Dr Godfrey Gandawa, has said that Government <u>may reconsider its position</u> on the ban of genetically modified organisms if a comprehensive study on their merits and demerits in agriculture is conducted. Dr Gandawa said there was need for close collaboration with the Agriculture, Mechanisation, and Irrigation Development Ministry to support development of biotechnological innovations in agriculture and other fields. The Agriculture Ministry can issue permits on GMO products and technologies but has ruled out lifting a ban on these until more research is available.

On the other hand, the Higher and Tertiary Education, Science and Technology Development Ministry has been lobbying Government to embrace GMO technologies for agriculture, medicine, and other fields.

Maize

The Government is encouraging farmers to sell their maize to private buyers since the Grain Marketing Board (GMB) does not have funds. The Deputy Agriculture Minister, Paddy Zhanda told the House of Assembly that the parastatal had to date not been allocated funds to procure maize due to resource constraints. He said GMB was not in the market to compete with private buyers but as the buyer of last resort. But legislators argued that the Government should not treat the parastatal as the buyer of last resort.

Bikita West legislator Munyaradzi Kereke said the GMB was by default the "buyer of first resort" as it was the closest to the people especially in remote areas. Therefore he urged GMB must play its part and buy from farmers. But Deputy Minister Zhanda insisted that farmers should look for markets elsewhere. He said the GMB was responsible for acquiring 500 000 metric tonnes for the country's strategic grain reserve.

Winter Wheat

According to agricultural analysts, production of winter wheat in Zimbabwe is expected to decline this year following a reduction in area put under the crop this winter from around 8 500 hectares last year to about 3 000 hectares this season. Output is expected to decline to below 10 000 tonnes from 14 000 tonnes harvested last year. Challenges that have continued to affect production of the crop include erratic power supply for irrigation, funding, and high costs of inputs. Zimbabwe requires 400 000 tonnes of wheat annually and shortages mean that the country has to meet the shortfall with costly imports from countries such as South Africa and Zambia.

Tobacco

Statistics from the Tobacco Industry and Marketing Board show that over US\$500 million worth of tobacco has gone under the hammer so far. TIMB said 162.8million kg of tobacco has been sold so far, indicating an 11% increase from the same period last year. Tobacco Sales Floor is the leading tobacco auctioneer so far this season with 21.9 million kg sold, followed by Premier Tobacco Floors with 11.1 million kg and then Boka Tobacco Sales Floor 7.5 million kg. Contract sales accounted for the rest

Though tobacco mass has increased this season, average prices are lower than those paid last year. At least 180 million kg are expected to be sold this year, up from 166 million kg in 2013. This season's average tobacco price has been US\$3.21, which is 13.8% less than last year's US\$3.72.

Tobacco Industry and Marketing Board

Destruction of Tobacco Stalks, Sowing And Transplanting Dates

All tobacco growers are reminded that the Plant Pests and Diseases Act [Chapter 19:08] requires that all tobacco stalks be destroyed by 15th May of every year.

Destruction of stalks helps to reduce carryover of diseases and pests. This is most effective when tobacco stalks are destroyed immediately after the final harvest.

Tobacco growers who fail to destroy tobacco stalks should be reported to Department of Research and Specialist Services (Plant quarantine Services Institute), AGRITEX, Tobacco Research Board (TRB) or TIMB.

Reports can be made at TIMB regional offices located in Bindura, Mvurwi, Chinhoyi, Karoi, Marondera and Rusape.

Growers should also take note of the following legislated dates:

Earliest date for sowing seed 1 June
Earliest date for transplanting 1 September
Last day of destroying all seedbeds 31 December

For a contravention of regulations requiring the destruction of tobacco plants by a specified date or prohibiting the planting of tobacco plants between specified dates, a grower will be subjected to the following-

• For a first offence, to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars for each hectare or part thereof in respect of which the offence is committed or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year or to both such fine and such imprisonment;

• For a second or subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars for each hectare or part thereof in respect of which the offence is committed or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding two years or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

FI Nino.

There have been a series of 3 strong Kelvin waves over the past 7 months. Each Kelvin wave pushed some water from the West Pacific Warm Pool towards the East Pacific, but the subsequent upwelling phase resulted in cooling. This week, a very strong "Upwelling" phase of a Kelvin wave is pushing across the Eastern Pacific, forcing colder waters from the subsurface towards the surface, cooling the Eastern Pacific surface waters. This cooling has put the index we use to track El Niño--the so-called "ENSO 3.4 index"--at -0.5°C, right at the border of La Niña conditions. This is happening while warm surface water is being pushed down into the sub-surface, resulting in massive warming below the surface. Here is the evolution of the subsurface SST structure beginning in January and ending this week:

BOTTOM LINE: The Pacific Ocean is now in a state that could reconstruct the base state of the Pacific, favouring an El Niño to develop later this spring. That being said, it's not a locked in solution yet as we need to monitor the atmosphere for future westerly wind bursts to help push the Western Pacific Warm Pool along.

ENSO Alert System Status: El Niño Watch

<u>Synopsis:</u> Chance of El Niño increases during the remainder of the year, exceeding 65% during summer.

ENSO-neutral continued during April 2014, but with above-average sea surface temperatures (SST) developing over much of the eastern tropical Pacific as well as persisting near the International Date Line (Fig. 1). The weekly SST indices were near to slightly above average and increasing in the Niño1+2, Niño3 and Niño3.4 regions, and above average in the Niño4 region (Fig. 2). The down welling phase of a strong oceanic Kelvin wave that began in January greatly increased the oceanic heat content during March and April (Fig. 3), and produced large positive subsurface temperature anomalies across the central and eastern Pacific (Fig. 4). The upper portion of these subsurface anomalies reached the sea surface, warming the waters east of 125°W longitude. Also during April, weak low-level westerly wind anomalies were observed over the far western Pacific, while upper-level easterly anomalies occurred over much of the Pacific. Convection was enhanced over the west-central equatorial Pacific (Fig. 5). These atmospheric and oceanic conditions collectively indicate a continued evolution toward El Niño.

The model predictions of ENSO for this summer and beyond are indicating an increased likelihood of El Niño compared with those from last month. Most of the models indicate that ENSO-neutral (Niño-3.4 index between -0.5°C and 0.5°C) will persist through part of the remainder of the Northern Hemisphere spring 2014 (Fig. 6), most likely transitioning to El Niño during the summer. There remains uncertainty as to exactly when El Niño will develop and an even greater uncertainty as to how strong it may become. This uncertainty is related to the inherently lower forecast skill of the models for forecasts made in the spring. While ENSO-neutral is favored for Northern Hemisphere spring, the chance of El Niño increases during the remainder of the year, exceeding 65% during the summer (click CPC/IRI consensus forecast for the chance of each outcome).

This discussion is a consolidated effort of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), NOAA's National Weather Service, and their funded institutions. Oceanic and atmospheric conditions are updated weekly on the Climate Prediction Centre web site (El Niño/La Niña Current Conditions and Expert Discussions). Forecasts for the evolution of El Niño/La Niña are updated monthly in the Forecast Forum section of CPC's Climate Diagnostics Bulletin. The next ENSO Diagnostics Discussion is scheduled for 5 June 2014. Zim to resume EU beef exports

May 27, 2014

Zimbabwe will soon resume beef exports to the lucrative European Union market, with negotiations to that effect already underway, a Cabinet Minister has said.

Speaking at a Press conference yesterday, Agriculture, Mechanisation and Irrigation Development Minister Dr Joseph Made said Cabinet would, in the coming few days, discuss a national strategy on livestock production in preparation for the exports.

Zimbabwe last sold its beef to Europe in 2001 before the exports were suspended because of an outbreak of foot and mouth disease.

"As we are talking, there are inquiries from Europe relating to the fact that we must focus on the livestock sector and the potential to re-enter the European market in terms of beef exports," said Dr Made.

"We are in agreement with the European Union that we must re-establish the green, the red and the white zone as it relates to foot and mouth and re-establishment of the foot and mouth fence across the country.

"It is not a secret as ruled by the World Trade Organisation that all beef entering the European market must be labelled GMO-free or GMO-fed beef.

"So, we are mindful of the fact that there is a niche market that relates to our own beef and we would want to participate in that sector because we are GMO-free in terms of our stock-feeds and this we have indicated in the sense that we have remained firm in terms of the content as it relates to GMO material.

"I also want to clarify that this is a Cabinet position as it relates to GMO that we will not allow the introduction of GMO materials."

Dr Made said the livestock sector had great potential to contribute to economic growth.

"In the coming seven days or so I will be announcing a national strategy relating to the livestock sector, this is assuming that Cabinet will be considering this matter in the coming days," he said. "We must focus on the livestock sector in its totality because Zimbabwe holds great potential in the sector."

Dr Made said that the livestock sector could create downstream industries that use by-products from livestock such as hides.

He said delivery of maize to the Grain Marketing Board had increased by up to four times more than what was delivered in the same period last year.

Farmers have delivered 5 400 metric tonnes of maize to the GMB so far, compared to the 1 600 metric tonnes that had been delivered during the same period last year.

Zimbabwe needs 500 000 metric tonnes for the strategic grain reserves.

He said Finance and Economic Development Minister Patrick Chinamasa had been tasked to mobilise resources to ensure timely payment of farmers for grain delivered.

In the past, Government delayed payment to farmers, negatively affecting their operations.
