# NEED TO FORMULATE AGRICULTURAL POLICY AT A NATIONAL LEVEL

- Work with the Government of Zimbabwe and visa versa
- Stop haemorrhaging of agricultural sector
- Formulate and establish form of security of tenure for all farmers
- Establish traditional funding mechanisms
- Address compensation and correct the past

#### INCREASE IRRIGATION POTENTIAL

- Expand and develop water resources
- Expand irrigation potential
- Develop favourable pricing system
- Stop conflicts with ZINWA and Sub-Catchment Councils over billing systems



#### JOINT PRESIDENTS COUNCIL

Principle function is to seek to ensure the best business environment possible for all farmers. This includes:-

- Following up on position papers on
  - RDC
    - Calling for reduction in land tax in regions 4 and 5
    - · Removal of levies on cattle sales
  - ZINWA
    - Calling for reduction of raw water for irrigation and livestock
  - VAT
    - Removal of VAT on all primary commodities
  - Electricity
    - Special tariff for agriculture
  - Transport
    - Special dispensation for farmers

#### LABOUR REFORM

- Create a win-win for employee and employer
- Revamp of labour laws

#### LAND COMMISSION BILL

- Play an active role in developing framework for the future
