#### Food Price Index dips to Lowest Level in 5 years

The Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO) Food Price Index averaged 179. 4 points in February 2015, down 1.8 points (1.0 percent) from its January value and 29 points (14.0 percent) below its level in February 2014. According to FAO, prices of sugar, meat and cereals recorded the largest decline while the prices of oils were relatively stable. Brazil's sugar cane production improved crop prospects, the Depreciation of the Brazilian currency against the U.S dollar and India's move to introduce a sugarcane export subsidy are among the reasons cited for the fall in the International sugar prices. The sugar price index fell by 4.9 percent in February 2015 on a month-on-month comparison.

# **Trade Updates**

# EU dictates the agenda for Economic Partnership Agreements Meeting in Madagascar in March 2015

In a renewed effort to push member countries in the Eastern and Southern Africa (ESA) to sign and implement interim Economic Partnerships Agreement (EPA) without further delay, the European Union (EU) is said to have refused to discuss any other issue apart from tariff reduction offers by ESA countries during the forthcoming EPA meetings scheduled for 9-12<sup>th</sup> March 2015 in Madagascar. This was revealed by a COMESA representative during a stakeholders consultative meeting that took place

at Ministry of Commerce Trade and Industry on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2015. The COMESA representative informed the meeting that the EU negotiators were not willing to attend the meeting in Madagascar unless ESA countries make commitments to ensure that they table their tariff liberalization schedules for negotiations. Zambia is one of the ESA countries that have not yet signed the Economic Partnership Agreement, while Zimbabwe had signed but currently revising the tariff liberalization schedule and is not implementing the EPA.

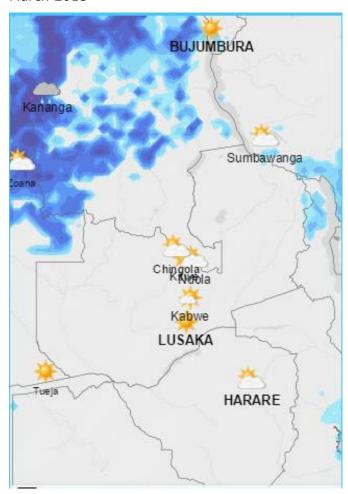
However, stakeholders expressed concern over the unilateral determination of the agenda by the EU negotiators noting that the EPA was being negotiated by equal partners and must exercise mutual respect in negotiations. The meeting observed that a number of issues of interest to Zambia were still outstanding and that it was not fair for the EU to unilaterally decide on the items to be included in the agenda for the Madagascar EPA meeting. Some of the key issues of interest to Zambia in the EPA negotiations include:

- Exclusion of sensitive products from tariff reductions;
- Allow ESA countries and Zambia flexibility to impose export taxes for value addition;
- Inclusion of automatic Special Safeguard Measures from protection against import surges;

The meeting also noted that Zambia's trading partners such as Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Botswana, South Africa, Kenya, Burundi, Rwanda, Lesotho, and Namibia, among others had already signed the Economic Partnership Agreement with the EU.

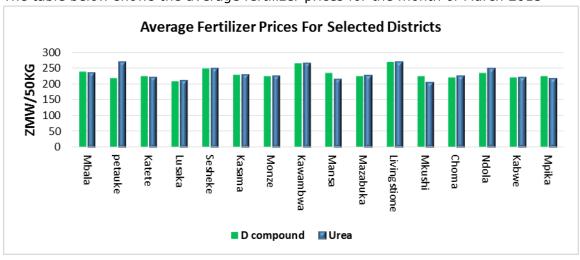

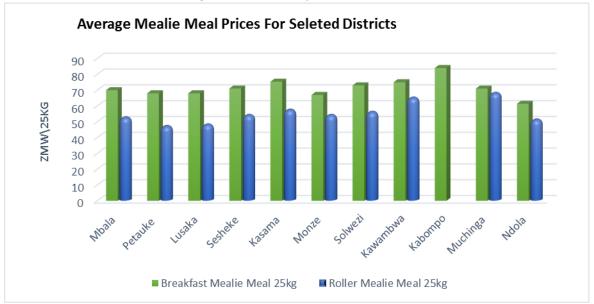

#### **Highlights**

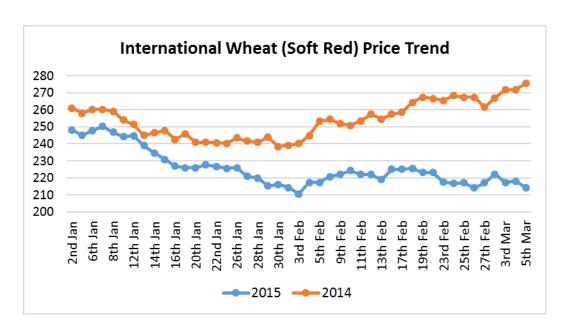
- Russia's wheat crop prospects have improved with the country's agricultural Minister stating that the effects of the dry and cold autumn on the crop was less than initially anticipated. The country expects a crop of about 100 million ton in 2015. Russia is one of the main exporters to North Africa and the Middle East.
- The news of a better than anticipated Russian crop coupled with reports of good weather prospects over the US wheat crop added pressure to the already falling international wheat prices.
- The Chicago wheat future price for delivery in July 2015 settled at US\$ 179.68/MT by end of day on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2015.
- Local wheat offer prices were averaging US\$523/ton in the week ending 5<sup>th</sup> March 2015.

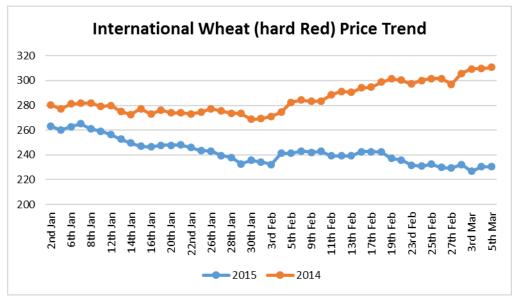

#### **Price trends**

The Safex international soft red and hard red wheat averaged US\$213/ton and US\$232/ton respectively in the week ending 5<sup>th</sup> March 2015. In comparison to the previous week ending 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2015 soft red recorded a price decline of 2.3% while hard red prices increased marginally by 0.86% percent on average.





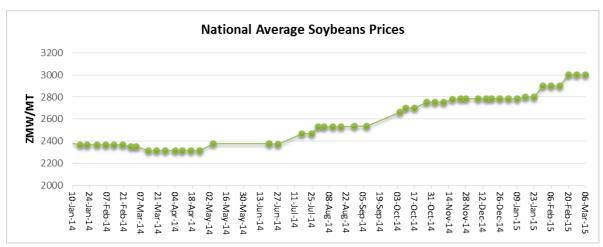

# Soya Beans

#### **Highlights**

- Concerns over the Brazilian truckers strike seem to have eased of last week as soya beans prices started to drop again. Indications are that Brazil's soya beans sells are slower than last year's with only 30 percent of the harvested crop having been sold by last week. Harvesting is still in progress and the country's storage capacity is being put to a test.
- Meanwhile palm oil production in Central and South America increased by 5
  percent in 2014 to 2.73 million tons according to oil world. Exports rose by 11
  percent.

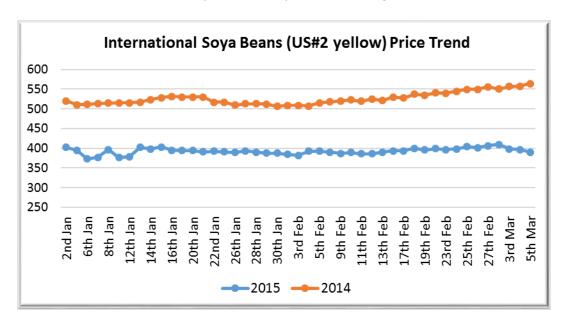
- Soya beans for July 2015 delivery on Chicago Mercantile Exchange ease slightly to trade at US\$365.60/ton on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2015.
- Local soya beans offer prices by traders were still averaging ZMK3000/ton in the week ending 9<sup>th</sup> March 2015.

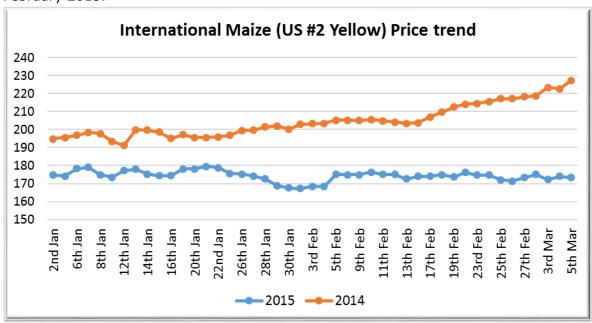
#### **Highlights**

• The Chinese grain stockpiling programme is expected to rise by 33 percent in 2015. According to the Chinese Finance Ministry, the country will spend over 24 billion US dollars stockpiling grains, edible oils and other materials.

- The Chicago maize future price for delivery in July 2015 was posted at US\$ 155.50/MT on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2015.
- Local maize offer prices has continued to average ZMK1, 450/ton on the ZNFU market price information system in the week ending 9<sup>th</sup> March 2015.

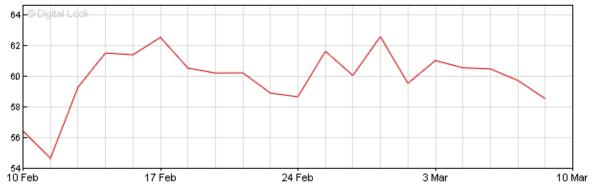
#### Cotton

#### **Highlights**

- The international Cotton Advisory Council (ICAC)has projected that world ending stocks, outside China, will increase for the second consecutive season from 7.9 to 9.5 million tons in the 2014/15 year. This will be the largest stock in 35 year and is 60% of the expected mill use during the same period.
- Meanwhile Chinese production has been projected lower by about 7 percent in the 2014/15 year with the country's consumption also expected to fall. ICAC has further projected a drop in the 2015/16 global production due to a supply glut.

Brent crude oil price declined to US\$57.04/barrel during the week ending  $9^{th}$  March 2015 as reported in the graph below.

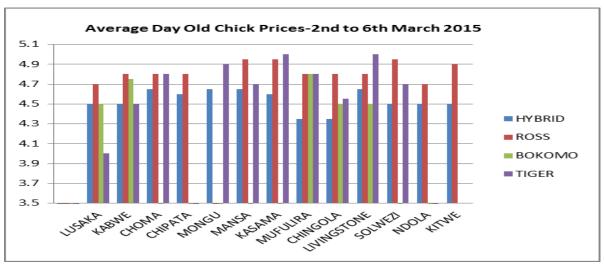

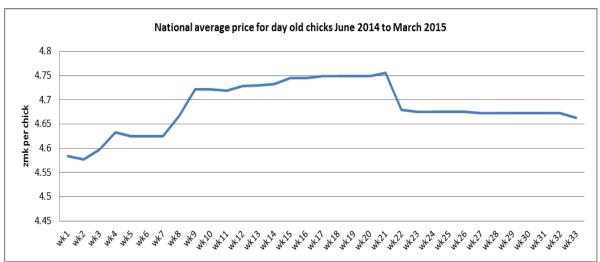
#### **AVERAGE DAY OLD CHICK PRICES**

The graph below shows the price of different brands of day old chicks in selected towns. The graph shows that the lowest price for day old chicks in the country is ZMW4 while the highest price is ZMW4.95 in Kasama.



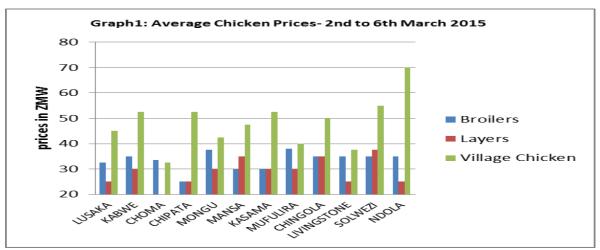

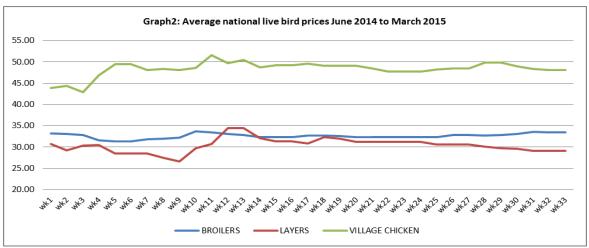
#### **AVERAGE LIVE BIRDS PRICES**

Graph1 below shows the average live bird prices in Lusaka, Choma, Kabwe, Chipata, Mongu Mansa, Mufulira, Chingola, Solwezi, Ndola, Kitwe and Livingstone. Compared to last week, the price of all live birds in towns displayed has been very stable with no notable changes registered.



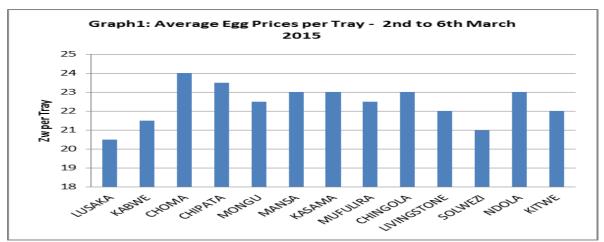

Graph 2 below shows the national average price trends for broilers, ex-layers and village chickens. Compared to the period between week 10 and week 14, the price of village chicken and layers has declined while the price of broiler chickens is at almost the same average price that was reported in week 10. The national average price of village chickens in week 33 was ZMW48.13 compared to national average of ZMW51.55 in week11. The price of ex-layers declined from ZMW34.44 in week 12 to ZMW29.13 in week 33. This is equivalent to a 15% decline in prices. At ZMW33.46 in week 33, the price of broilers is very close to ZMW33.50 recorded in week 11.



#### **AVERAGE EGG PRICES**

Graph1 below shows average retail prices of table eggs in selected provincial centres around the country. There have been no significant changes in the price of eggs during the course of the week. Choma is still posting the highest price at ZMW24 and Lusaka posting lowest price at ZMW20.5.



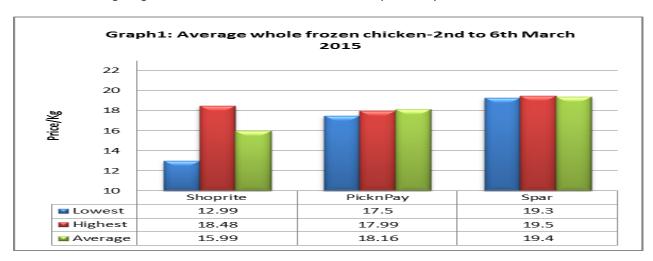

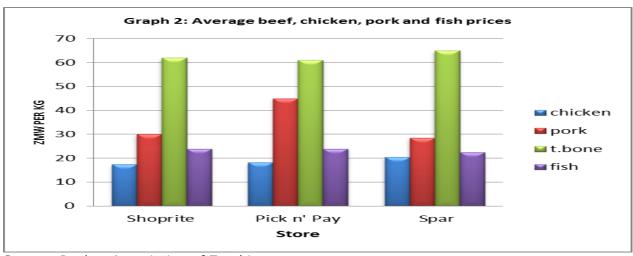


#### **AVERAGE WHOLE DRESSED CHICKEN PRICES**

**Graph1** below shows average prices of whole frozen chickens in the three chain stores around in Lusaka. The graph shows that Shoprite has the lowest average price at ZMW15.99 with the lowest going for ZMW12.99 and the highest going for ZMW18.48. The average price for frozen whole chicken in Pick n' Pay is ZMW20.35 with the lowest and highest going for ZMW17.50 and ZMW17.99 respectively. The average price for frozen whole chickens in Spar is ZMW19.40 with the lowest and highest price of frozen whole chicken going for ZMW19.30 and ZMW19.50 respectively.



Graph 2 below shows the average prices for beef, chicken and Pork products in the three chain stores in lusaka. The graph shows that chicken is the cheapest protein in all the three stores followed by fish, pork and t.bone.



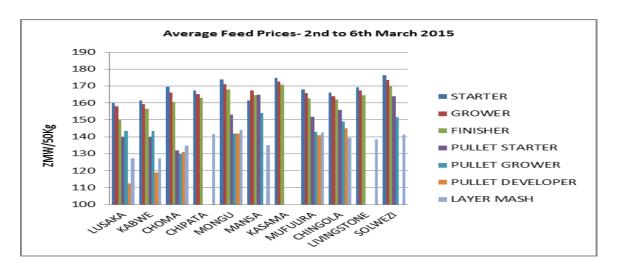
Graph3 shows the average price trend for whole frozen dressed chicken in Lusaka from June 2014 – March 2015. The graph shows that the average price of whole dressed frozen chicken has declined from ZMW18.62 in week 32 to ZMW17.85 in week 33.



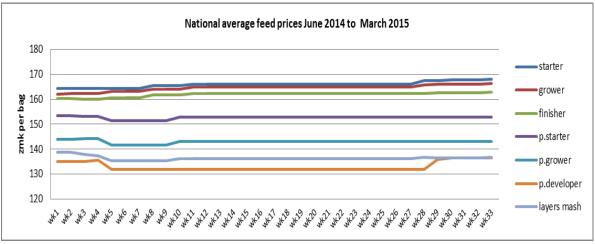

The graph below shows average weekly feed prices in selected towns. The graph shows that the average poultry stock feed prices are lowest in Lusaka and Kabwe and Highest in Kasama, Mongu and Solwezi. The graph further shows that pullet feeds are generally lower than broiler feeds.
