EU milk quotas scrapped

EU milk production quotas have been abolished after more than three decades of efforts to prevent overproduction. The Irish Republic, the Netherlands and Germany are all expected to increase production sharply. This will lead to increased milk supply on the international market and reduced farm gate prices for EU countries.

The ending of quotas is both a challenge and an opportunity for the EU. It is a challenge because EU dairy farmers will have to live under completely new circumstances and volatility will surely accompany them along the road as production increases and farm gate prices fall. But certainly it is an opportunity in terms of growth and jobs in the EU. For Africa in general and Zambia in particular this implies that there will be a huge milk pool flowing our way which if not controlled could lead to thwarting of our infant dairy industry and subsequent

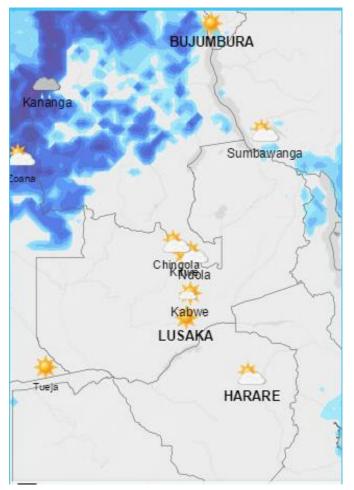
stagnation and job losses within the dairy subsector. The small-scale farmers, who are at the receiving end of the global milk price slumps, would be the worst hit by any milk dumping into Zambia. Prices of dairy products on the international market have already started falling. For instance a tone of powdered milk is currently costing U\$ 2900 from U\$ 3175 early March this year.

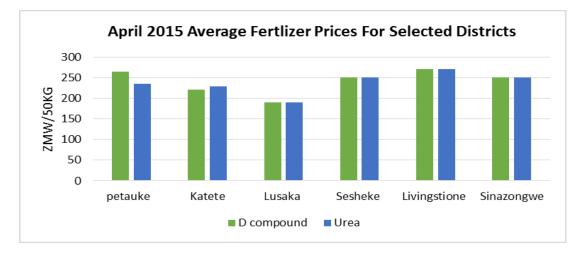

Local Commodity Price Trends



April 2015 Mealie Meal Prices

As can be seen in the table below, declines in mealie meal prices were observed in some selected districts. Breakfast and roller meal prices in Solwezi reduced by K5 respectively to reach an average of K68 and K51 in April 2015. In Kawambwa, April breakfast and roller meal prices reduced by K6 and K3 kwacha respectively from prices recorded in March. Lusaka breakfast and roller Mealie prices registered a K5 and K3 decline respectively from the prices recorded in March.

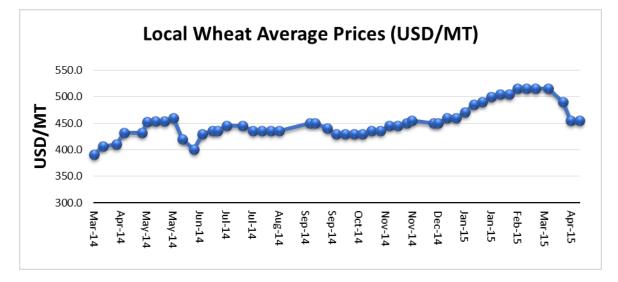

Wheat

Highlights

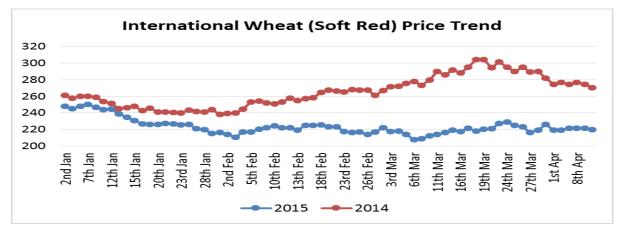
- The U.S wheat exports are forecast down 21 percent in the 2014/15 season by its government to a 12 year low. The U.S lost its position as the largest wheat exporter to Europe last year.
- By 3rd April 2015, South Africa's wheat exports destined for Zambia had amounted to 10,559 metric tons.

- The Chicago soft red wheat future price for delivery in May 2015 settled at US\$ 202.67/MT on 13th April 2015.
- Local wheat offer prices were averaging US\$455/ton in the week ending 10th April 2015



Price trends

The Safex international soft red and hard red wheat averaged US\$236.08/ton and US\$221.22/ton respectively in the week ending 10th April 2015. In comparison to the previous week, soft red recorded a price increment of 0.10% and while hard red prices fell by 0.43 percent on average.



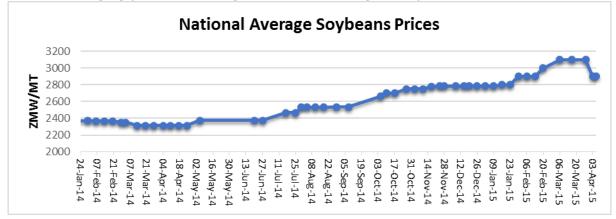

Soya Beans

Highlights

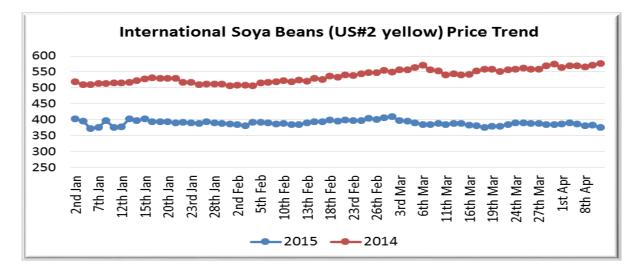
• India's 2014/14 soya meal exports have been lowered by about 10 percent to 6 million tons on account of a lower exportable surplus according to USDA projections. Besides Zambia, India is an alternative source of soya meal for Zimbabwe when local supply cannot meet its demand.

- Meanwhile global soya beans ending stocks have been projected higher at 89.55 million tons for the 2014/15 season.
- Soya beans for May 2015 delivery on Chicago Mercantile Exchange were around US\$349.43/ton on 13th April 2015
- Soybeans offer prices as captured the ZNFU 4455 price information system were still averaging price of K2.9/Kg in the week ending 10th April, 2015

Maize

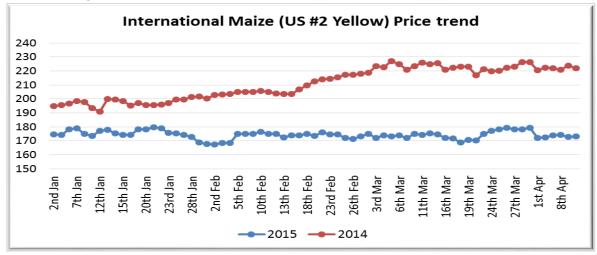
Highlights

After a break of one year from maize imports, South Africa recorded a total of 21,137 yellow maize imports from Argentina in the week ending 3rd April 2015. According to South Africa's National Agricultural Marketing Council, South Africa is expected to import a total of 550,000MT of maize in the 2015/16 marketing season.

- Meanwhile, the USDA projected a 0.23 percent in the global maize output in the 2014/15 production year to 991.92 million tons. Increments in international prices are therefore expected to be suppressed for the 2014/15 crop. Southern African prices are however likely to rise due to the natural calamities experienced in major producing countries.
- The Chicago maize futures price for delivery in May 2015 was pegged at US\$ 147.08/MT on 13th April 2015.
- Local maize offer prices in Lusaka are around ZMk1300/ton and reduce with increasing distance from the line of rail.

Price trends

During the week ending 10th April 2015, international maize fob prices as recorded by Safex averaged US\$173.53/ton.

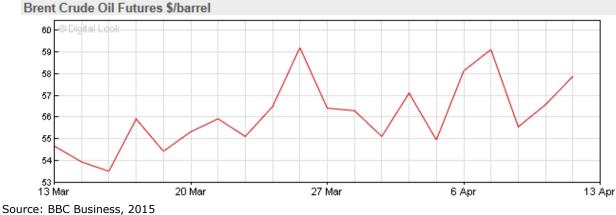
Cotton

Highlights

- China is expecting its cotton output to fall from 6.46 million tons in the 2014/15 season to 5.77 million tons in the 2015/16 season according to the Beijing Cotton Outlook. China and India are the world's largest producers and consumers of cotton. A major change in their production levels would therefore impact international prices of the commodity.
- Meanwhile the USDA has forecast 1 percent drop in the global production of cotton in the 2014/15 season to 25.959 million tons mainly on account of reduced production prospects by China, India and Brazil. Ending stocks are however forecast higher in the 2014/15 season than the previous one.
- Cotton prices for May delivery were pegged at US\$0.6506/pound (≈US\$1.43/kg) on 13th April 2015, while Cotlook "A" index prices were pegged at US\$0.7285/pound (≈US\$1.60/kg) by close of business on 10th April 2015.

Crude oil

- After a fall in the previous week mainly on news of increased global output, international oil prices have taken an upward spike. Brent prices settled at US\$58.68/barrel by 16:00hrs CAT on 13th April 2015, 12:00Hrs CAT, while WTI was pegged at US\$52.34/barrel.
- Oman's settlement price for June delivery was around US\$56.51/barrel early morning • on 13th April 2015.

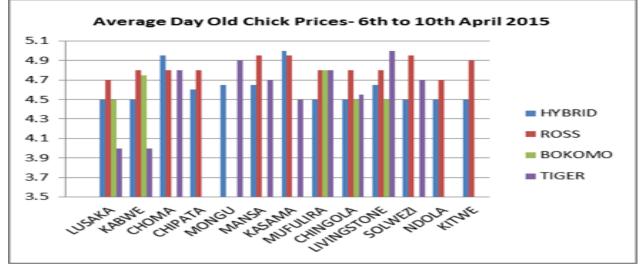

From the table above, it can be seen that the average price of a 500mls fresh milk sachet reduced by 12% from K 4.82 to K4.30 in the week ending 10th April 2015 and that of 1litre fresh milk reduced by 3% from K9.97 to K 9.70. The Price of 500mls yogurt cup equally reduced by a similar percentage to that of 1 litre fresh milk (3%). Generally average prices of dairy products showed slight reductions between March and April 2015.

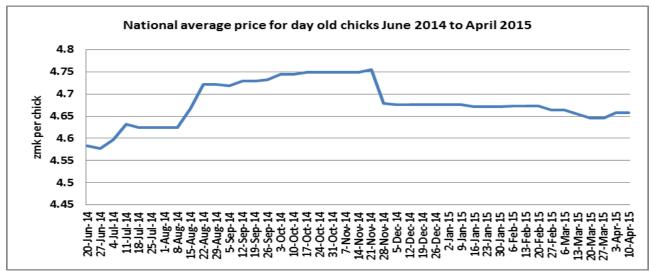
AVERAGE DAY OLD CHICK PRICES

Graph1 shows the price of different brands of day old chicks in selected towns. The price of day old chicks remained stable during the course of the week with no significant changes in the towns displayed.

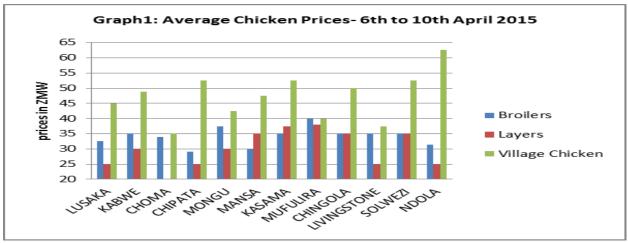

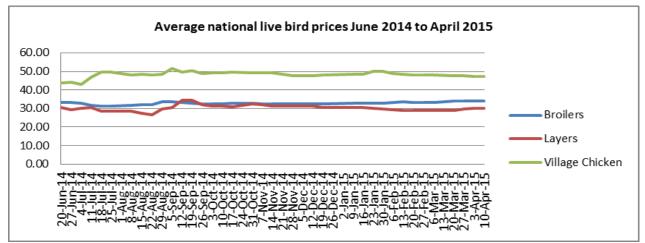
AVERAGE LIVE BIRDS PRICES

Graph1 below shows the average live bird prices in Lusaka, Choma, Kabwe, Chipata, Mongu Mansa, Mufulira, Chingola, Solwezi, Ndola, Kitwe and Livingstone. The price for live birds had been stable during the course of the week except for Solwezi where the price of Layers and village chickens reduced from ZMW37.50 to ZMW35.00 and from ZMW55.00 to ZMW52.50 representing 4.5% and 6.7% price reduction respectively. This can be attributed to an increase in the supply of these live birds.

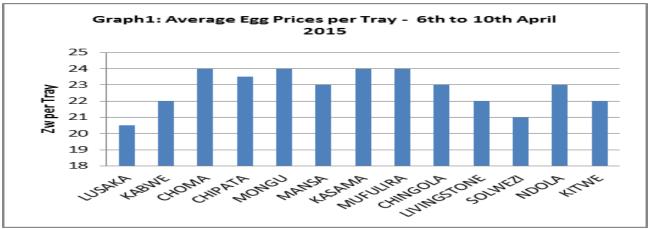
Graph 2 on the other hand shows the national average price trends for broilers, exlayers and village chickens. The graph shows that the national average price of village chicken and layers slightly declined while the average national price of broilers remained stable at ZMW34.13. The average national price for village chickens and layers was ZMW47.19 and ZMW30.04 respectively.

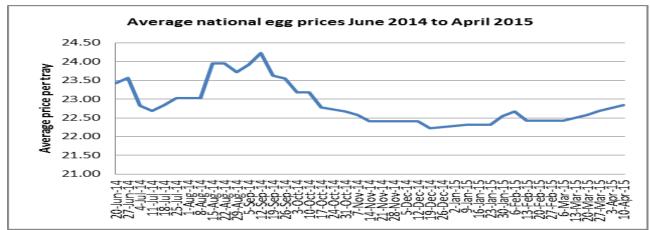
AVERAGE EGG PRICES

Graph1 below shows average retail prices of table eggs in selected provincial centres around the country. The price of eggs had been stable during the course of the week in all towns displayed except for Solwezi where the average price had risen from ZMW21.00 to ZMW22.00 representing 4.8% price increase.

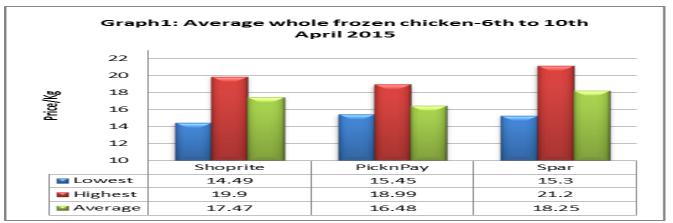

AVERAGE WHOLE DRESSED CHICKEN PRICES

Graph1 below shows average prices of whole frozen chickens in the three chain stores around in Lusaka. The average price of whole dressed chicken in Shoprite was ZMW17.47 with the lowest average price at ZMW14.99 and the highest going for ZMW19.90. The average price for frozen whole chicken in Pick n' Pay was ZMW16.48 with the lowest and highest going for ZMW15.45 and ZMW18.99 respectively. The average price for frozen whole chickens in Spar was ZMW18.25 with the lowest and highest price of grazen at ZMW15.30 and ZMW21.20 respectively.

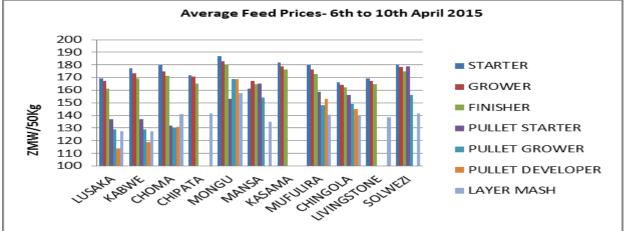

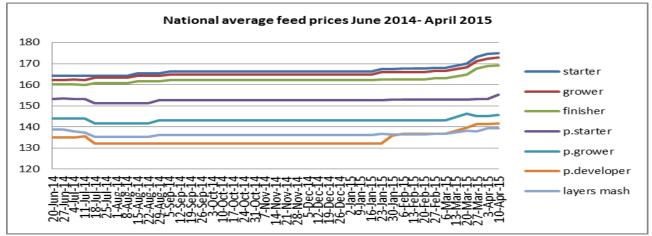
AVERAGE FEED PRICES

Graph 1 show average weekly feed prices in selected towns. The graph shows that the average poultry stock feed prices were lowest in Lusaka and Kabwe and Highest in Kasama, Mongu and Solwezi. The graph further shows that pullet feeds were generally lower than broiler feeds. Furthermore, the graph also shows that Mongu had the highest prices for feed and prices in Lusaka were generally lower than most of the towns displayed.

Graph 2 shows the national average price trend of feed between June 2014 and April 2015. The graph shows that the average price of feed rose in most towns as of 10th April 2015. This is mostly because some towns are still adjusting their prices after the recent price hikes. The price increase could be attributed to the devaluation of the kwacha against the dollar as well as a general increase in the price of inputs.
