




- Russia, as earlier anticipated, lifted the duty on wheat exports which had been introduced to help stabilize local prices. The country hopes to export an additional 1 million tons by the end of the current 2014/15 marketing year and expects to impose another form of export tax when its new marketing season begins on 1st July. Media reports indicate that, come July 1, exporters may need to pay US\$1/ton as long as Russia's domestic price does not exceed US\$242/ton.
- In an effort to ensure wheat production does not fall this season, the Zimbabwean government has finalized payments to farmers who had supplied the countries Grain marketing board. The government has further been quoted to be mobilizing basal dressing fertilizers to loan out to farmers whose crop has germinated. Last year, Zimbabwe produced about 10,000tons of wheat, just slightly above its weekly consumption requirement. The country has thus been import dependent to meet its local wheat demand.
- South Africa's Wheat exports destined for Zambia totalled 20,536MT by the week ending 15th May 2015.
- The Chicago soft red wheat future price for delivery in July 2015 settled at US\$ 189.30/MT on 24th May 2015.
- Local wheat offer prices are still pegged at US\$455/ton on average.



Price trends

The Safex international soft red and hard red wheat averaged US\$210.59/ton and US\$224.87/ton respectively in the week ending 22^{nd} May 2015. In comparison to the previous week, both soft red and hard red recorded price increments of 6.52% and 4.84% on average.




Soya Beans

- Argentina's soya beans industry is under some unrest due to a strike by oil
 crushers demanding for a hike in wages. This has caused delays in the export of
 soya beans and its products with the striking workers threatening to block the
 country's major export route. Argentina is among the world's leading producers
 and exporters of the oilseed
- Indonesia has delayed implementation of a regulation that will force palm oil exporters to pay a levy of US\$50 per tonne of shipment with the earnings set to be used to fund biodiesel production subsidies. The regulation has already been signed and was due for implementation end of May. Delays in establishing guidelines and a biodiesel agency may hold back the implementation until August 2015.
- Meanwhile Malaysia palm oil exports over the period 1-20th May increased by over 50 percent in comparison to the April 1st-20th 2015 exports. According to Malaysia's Palm oil council, exports exponentially rose to China, Europe and India
- Soya beans for July 2015 delivery on Chicago Mercantile Exchange were around US\$339.59/ton on 25th May 2015.
- Soybeans offer prices as captured by the ZNFU 4455 price information system tipped slightly last week and were averaging price of K2.72/Kg in the week ending 22nd May, 2015.



Price trends

International prices of US No. 2 yellow soya beans on Safex traded lower 2.21 percent and averaged US\$377.66/ton during the week ending 22nd May. All prices are fob gulf.



Maize

- Kenya's Maize sub sector has continued to suffer from the Maize Lethal necrosis virus with local scientists now suspecting that the virus could be spread through the soil.
- The Chicago maize futures price for delivery in July 2015 was pegged at US\$ 141.72/MT on 25th May 2015.


 Local maize offer prices averaged ZMW1, 240/ton in the week ending 2nd May 2015.

During the week ending 15th May 2015, international maize fob prices as recorded by Safex averaged US\$167.41/ton, below the previous week's average by 0.41 percent.





Cotton

- Ethiopia's cotton imports are expected to expand over the next two years due to rising demand by the textile industry. An import of about 8,000MT has been forecast for the 2014/15 year by the USDA and a further increase to 12,000MT in the subsequent year.
- Cotton prices for July delivery on the new York market were pegged at US\$0.6330/pound (≈US\$1.39/kg) on 24th May, while Cotlook "A" index prices were pegged at US\$0.7185/pound (≈US\$1.58/kg) 22nd May 2015.

Crude oil

- According to the US Energy Information Agency, the low crude oil prices and increased petroleum demand has generally led to an increase in the refinery margins globally.
- International crude oil prices have continued their "see-saw" ride with prices falling last week, stripping off the gains attained the previous week. Appreciation of the US dollar aided the price fall.
- Brent crude oil prices settled at US\$65.37/ barrel while WTI was pegged at US\$59.88/barrel early morning on 25th May 2015.
- Oman's settlement price for July delivery was around US\$62.85/barrel on 25th May 2015.





DOMESTIC POULTRY PRICES


AVERAGE DAY OLD CHICK PRICES

Graph1 shows the price of different breeds of day old chicks in selected towns. The price of day old chicks has been stable the past month with no notable changes.






AVERAGE LIVE BIRDS PRICES

Graph1 below shows the average live bird prices in Lusaka, Choma, Kabwe, Chipata, Mongu Mansa, Mufulira, Chingola, Solwezi, Ndola, Kitwe and Livingstone. Live bird prices were relatively stable during the course of the week with no significant changes.





Graph 2 on the other hand shows the national average price trends for broilers, exlayers and village chickens. The graph also shows that the price of broilers, layers and village chickens has been flat the past three weeks. This can be attributed to a stable supply of these live birds on the market. The average national price of village chicken, ex-layers and broilers last week was ZMW46.49, ZMW29.63 and ZMW35.38 respectively.




AVERAGE EGG PRICES

Graph1 below shows average retail prices of table eggs in selected provincial centres around the country. There were no changes in the price of eggs during the course of the week. Lusaka maintained lowest prices, while Choma, Mongu, Kasama and Mufulira had the highest prices.






AVERAGE WHOLE DRESSED CHICKEN PRICES

Graph1 below shows average prices of whole frozen chickens in the three chain stores around in Lusaka. Shoprite had the lowest average price for frozen whole chickens this week at ZMW17.79. On the other hand, Spar had the highest average price this week at ZMW19.10 while the average price for frozen whole chicken in Pick n' Pay was ZMW18.99.

Graph 2 shows the average prices for beef, chicken and Pork products in the three chain stores in Lusaka. The graph shows that chicken is the cheapest protein in all the three stores.




Graph3 shows the average price trend for whole frozen dressed chicken in Lusaka from June 2014 – May 2015. The graph shows that the average price of frozen whole dressed chicken remained flat the past two weeks at an average price of ZMW18.63.





AVERAGE FEED PRICES

Graph 1 show average weekly feed prices in selected towns. The graph shows that the average poultry stock feed prices are lowest in Lusaka and Kabwe and Highest in Mongu. The graph further shows that pullet feeds are generally lower than broiler feeds.



Graph 2 shows the national average price trend of feed prices from june 2014 to May 2015. The graph shows that the average price of feed has been flat the past three weeks for all types of feed displayed.
