## COMMERCIAL FARMERS' UNION OF ZIMBABWE OSCAR AWARD 2015

The Commercial Farmers' Union Farming Oscar Award for Zimbabwe has a long and proud history, having been introduced in 1961 by the late Mr. CG Tracey during his term as Vice President at the Commercial Farmers' Union. He introduced the award in recognition of "those people who have generally done well for agriculture."

This annual Oscar has become known as the "Farming Oscar" to be presented to some person or persons who have given outstanding service to agriculture, and has been awarded to people who have contributed to the industry in its widest sense.

Over the years winners have been chosen from the practical and scientific disciplines of agriculture, as well as from the administration and leadership roles with the winners selected in recognition of having contributed significantly to the agricultural progress in Zimbabwe.

This years' winner is no exception, and fits the required profile as having given outstanding service in the advancement of agriculture.

Our recipient was born in 1961. His love of farming and especially animals came from spending time with his grandfather on their farm at Featherstone. He spent most of his school and University holidays on this farm which later stimulated his career in veterinary work. In 1985 he obtained the qualification of BVSc in Pretoria.

After qualifying his main goal was to travel and see the world and having spent two years overseas, he returned to Zimbabwe and opened his own practice. This practice grew significantly and within a short period of time he was covering a large area of Manicaland Region.

He was then offered a position with Coopers Zimbabwe as a Technical Advisor and later promoted to Marketing Manager. During this period he was able to become more involved in his profession and was able to serve as President of the Veterinary Association and on the Council of Veterinary Surgeons for Zimbabwe.

Working with all stakeholders in the Livestock industry our recipient became involved in the Livestock Identification Trust and was fundamental in allowing producers to comply with traceability requirements for international trade.

In 1998, the Board of Triple C Pigs offered him a position as an understudy to the Chief Executive. At this time Triple C Pigs was the single largest pig unit in Africa.

This year's recipient also spent some time with Colcom Agriculture and was instrumental in increasing the production of sows at Triple C Pigs from 2200 to 8000 sows.

Regrettably in 2008 he left Zimbabwe due to the deteriating conditions within Zimbabwe, fortunately for Zimbabwe he did not stay away too long and returned in 2010 to continue veterinary consultancy to both pig and cattle industries to this day.
