### WARMA TO CONSULT FARMERS ON WATER PRICING STRATEGY

The Water Resource Management Authority (WARMA) is currently undertaking stakeholder consultations on the draft Water Pricing Strategy for Zambia.

According to the draft Water Pricing Strategy, 45% of Water Resource Management Costs will be recovered from agriculture users, while 40% and 5% will be recovered from hydropower users and

mining companies respectively. Other players such as water utilities and bulk suppliers, and industry users will each account for 5% of Water Resource Management Costs.

Members are encouraged to read the draft Water Pricing Strategy document and submit to ZNFU by close of business on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2017. ### **COPPERBELT REGION**

#### **COPPERBELT IN IRISH POTATO SHORTAGE**

Copperbelt has in the recent past recorded an acute shortage of Irish potatoes for almost three months running.

Mpongwe which began production of Irish potatoes two years ago did not produce for both local or export consumption this season. According sources, the farmers avoided to produce Irish potatoes because of the high cost of planting materials (potato seed) which was coming mostly from South Africa. A farmer in Mpongwe also attributed this to the bad roads leading to the market, which was pinpointed as a major contributing factor to the high cost of production.

AFCR VESTOCK VESTOCK Meanwhile, traders have taken advantage of this shortage and are supplying the commodity from Nakonde and Tanzania and selling a 10kg pocket of potatoes at between K60 and K80 at almost all green markets around the Copperbelt. Chain stores have also hiked the prices to around K70 per 10kg pocket.

### **NORTHERN REGION**

### NIRAS CONDUCTS CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING FOR FARMERS

NIRAS Zambia has conducted a five-day capacity building training programme for farmer organisations from Northern, Luapula and Muchinga Provinces.

Among farmer organizations that underwent the training include Kasama, Luwingu, Mwense, Mansa, Mpika and Nakonde District Farmers' Associations (DFAs).

Others are District Cooperative Unions from Northern, Muchinga and Luapula Provinces. The objective of the training is to strengthen farmer organisations in various aspects of group management. The topics covered included; group formation, group dynamics and conflict management, strategic planning, Business management, constitution making and leadership skills. The programme is under the Small production and productivity programme (S3P). Also selected Information Centres (ICs) in the three provinces are being trained in various districts.

### FARMERS URGED TO SAFEGUARD FARM PRODUCE

Mbala DFA Chairperson Mr. Hector Chonya has advised farmers in Mbala to safeguard this year's produce to avoid hunger at household level.

This came to light during a membership mobilization meeting held at Kalola Information Centre. Mr Chonya was happy with this year's rainfall pattern, which the district has received. He further said that the favourable rainfall would enhance a good harvest hence the need to safeguard the produce for future use. Farmers in the district have expressed optimistic that the harvest will be good and appealed to the DFA Chairperson to find reliable market for the produce.

#### **CEEC HOLDS YOUTH EXHIBITION IN KASAMA**

The Citizen Economic Commission (CEEC) on Friday last week held a youth exhibition in Kasama.

The exhibition was meant for the youths to showcase their skills and what they can offer to the community. Youth farmers were also showcasing their skills in Agriculture produce.

CEEC exhibition Manager Mr. Walusungu Banda was impressed with the response from youth farmers and other stakeholders who came to exhibit. Most youths talked to expressed happiness with the exhibition and appealed to CEEC to conduct such activities quarterly and involve other youths in various districts of Northern Province. This was the first youth exhibition to be held in Kasama.

Mr. Walusungu appealed to other stakeholders to come on board and try to help uplift the skills of the youths in the Province.

#### LUMPY SKIN & ANAPLASMOSIS BREAK OUT IN MAZABUKA & CHIKANKATA DISTRICTS

The department of Livestock has confirmed the outbreak of Anaplasmosis (Heart water) and Lumpy skin disease, which has so far affected some animals in Chikankata and Mazabuka Districts.



Farmers in both Districts are in a panic mode as they seek to control the diseases before they lose more animals. Both Districts have received normal to above rainfall which has resulted in the outbreak of diseases, which are associated with heavy rains.
