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
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Why Land Governance?

Land Central to Africa's Economic Development


- Land in Agriculture
 - Majority of Africans rely on access to land/ Natural resources for their livelihoods
 - Land is main factor for production
 - Secure Land Rights as means to access credit and long term Investment on land
- Increasing land needs in other economic sectors:
 - Conservation/ tourism
 - Manufacturing, mining
 - Settlement
 - Energy, infrastructure etc.
- Africa has abundant land resources

Land Matters at AU

➤ AU Assembly adopted a declaration on Land Issues and Challenges in Africa in 2009

Key resolutions in the AU declaration:

- Ensure land laws provide for equitable access to land and related resources
- > Strengthen security of land tenure for women

• Expectations of the Commission working with RECs, UNECA, AfDB and partners:

- Coordinate activities and facilitate Member States to develop/review their land policies
- Establish mechanisms for tracking and reporting progress by member states

- AU Agenda 2063 adopted in 2013 calls for:
 - > Sustainable land management practices
 - > Reversing land degradation and desertification
 - > Equitable access to land by all
 - Security of land tenure for women
- Agenda 2063 also calls for implementation of:
 - > AU Framework and Guidelines on Land Policy in Africa
 - Guiding Principles on Large Scale Land Based Investments in Africa
- In June 2014, African Heads of State and Government adopted the Malabo Declaration on "Accelerated Agricultural Growth and Transformation for Share Prosperity and Improved Livelihoods"





Strengthening Capacities for Land Governance in Africa (SLGA)--ongoing

Objective

"The Human and institutional capacities for realizing sustainable land policies that pay particular attention to the rights of marginalized groups like small-scale farmers, pastoralists and women are strengthened across Africa."

Expected outputs

- Training and education programs increased in quantity and improved in quality
- The NELGA is established under the leadership of LPI
- The analytical capacities of the African universities are strengthened







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Strengthening Capacities for Land Governance in Africa (SLGA)--ongoing

Functions of NELGA

- Provide and facilitate academic education and training for African land professionals
- Define an agenda for research working closely with the LPI, and conduct applied research on land related issues pertinent to the AU/Africa's agenda on land.
- Develop a repository for data, indicators and information for improved land related data and statistics, as well as improved Land Information Systems (LIS);
- 4. Promote knowledge management, dissemination and networking/Act as secretariat for the Conference on Land Policy in Africa/ establish a Journal for Land Policy in Africa,
- 5. Design appropriate monitoring and evaluation system; and implement pilots to facilitate tracking of land related initiatives, programs and projects

- Date: 14-17 November 2017 in Addis Ababa
- Theme: "The Africa We Want: Achieving socioeconomic transformation through inclusive and equitable access to land by the youth."
 - Aligned with AU designation of on 2017 as African's year of youth as agents for socioeconomic transformation: "Harnessing Africa's Demographic Dividend through Investment in youth"
 - Africa –most youthful continent -- 65% of persons between the productive and employable ages of 15 to 35 years
 - Enhancing equitable access to land by the youth will contribute towards realization of the "Africa We Want" as envisioned in Agenda 2063.
