Tomorrow thousands of farmers and farm workers must legally stop all farming operations.

At the same Zimbabweans look starvation in the face.

Under the Section 8 Compulsory acquisition and eviction notice the ownership of the property immediately cedes to the Ministry of Lands and Agriculture who is the acquiring authority. Permission to carry on normal farming operations can only come from the acquiring authority, any other signatory may not in law be recognised.

Since the 10th May farmers under section 8 notice were on a 45-day notice period to stop farm production and a 90-day eviction from their homes.
