ZNFU CALLS FOR NATIONAL BUDGET PROPOSALS FOR 2018

The Ministry of Finance has issued a call for national budget submissions for the 2018 national budget which is presented to parliament, debated and approved before the year closes in readiness for implementation by 1st January every year.

The recommended format for all proposals is as follows:

- 1) Names and contact details of the proposer [Phone, Email, Fax and Postal Address];
- 2) Sector of Proposal
- 3) Policy area of interest [e.g. taxation policy, wage policy, infrastructure programme, etc.]
- 4) Brief background to or overview of the subject;
- 5) Disadvantages, shortcomings, weaknesses or challenges of the current policy/program/project/situation;
- 6) Proposed policies or corrective measures; and
- 7) Expected impact or implications of the proposed policies or measures.

Members are invited to respond and submit their submissions to **the ZNFU through** judy.hamonzwe@znfu.org.zm **by 21st July 2017 or simply reply to this email**. Thereafter, the ZNFU Tax Committee will convene to consolidate the final ZNFU submission.

BIRD-FLU SCARE: PAZ CALLS FOR INCREASED BIO-SECURITY

As the bird flu scare comes to bear on the region, the Poultry Association of Zambia (PAZ) has called on poultry farmers to take precautionary measures by stepping up bio-security on their farms.

PAZ Executive Manager Dominic Chanda has also called for a border high -alert to swat possibilities of poultry products being smuggled into the country saying this will have a devastating impact on the country's poultry sector.

He has also warned that allowing this would result into the drowning of the local poultry sector.

"We need to be vigilant, increase biosecurity at farmsteads and fence off areas where birds have a likelihood to interact with other birds. Farmers should also institute open feed restrictions to avoid other foreign birds feeding from them. We have laboured over the years to grow this sector, we have no choice but to protect our industry," he says.

He, however, maintains that the local market is safe from bird flu.

Zimbabwe, South Africa and the Congo DR have been hit by the bird flu and poultry imports from these countries have been banned.

LAKE KARIBA WATER LEVELS DROP AGAIN

With the dry season closing, Lake Kariba water levels have continued to drop, with July 12 recording a drop by 0.05 metres.

During the week under review, water levels dropped to 483.13 meters, this was after reaching its peak of 483.22 meters as recorded on 23rd and 24th June 2017. Last year on the same date of 12th July 2017, the Lake level was 480.20 meters, which translates into a difference of 23 per cent.


Below is the graph showing water level movement as captured by the Zambezi River Authority (ZRA);

MUMBWA REQUESTS FOR SMALLSCALE MECHANIZED EQUIPMENT

Farmers in Mumbwa have requested to be assisted with a scheme on small-scale mechanized equipment, that will help them especially with the post-harvest crop management, which has proved to be problematic.

This came to light when Mumbwa ZNFU staff undertook visitations to three Information Centers (ICs) namely Nkhulumazhiba, Mukubu and Mankumaulau.

Mr Barick Mudarrick, the contact farmer for Mankumaulua IC, said that people are no longer interested in piece works anymore because their fields are just too big and workers are hard to find even when one uses animal drought power: "As we speak, no farmer can say he or she has finished harvesting soya beans later-on maize. We therefore want ZNFU to come up with a scheme that will help acquire small-scale mechanized equipment to help us be efficient."
