NO LOAD-SHEDDING; ZESCO ASSURES FARMERS

Zesco Limited has assured farmers that there will be no load shedding as the winter crop reaches its vital maturity stage.

Zesco Limited made the pronouncement during a ZNFU/ZESCO stakeholders' meeting at the ZNFU Secretariat in Lusaka on Thursday 20th July 2017.

Zesco Limited also told the meeting that the water levels outlook are stable with Itezhi Tezhi sitting on 97 percent, Kafue Gorge at 86 per cent and Kariba at 55 per cent. The power utility says this is a better outlook than 2016.

It was further intimated that currently Kafue Gorge is producing recommended power of 900 megawatts, Kariba at 380 megawatts, Victoria Falls at 100 megawatts Itezhi Tezhi -120 megawatts and Maamba at 200 megawatts. The country is still importing 80 megawatts from Karpower, bringing the total to 1, 780 megawatts. This figure is, sometimes, pushed up to meet demand, especially in the evenings.

Zesco also said there are discussions with ESKOM of South Africa to import about 500 megawatts.

REGULATE FISH IMPORTS

Government has been called upon to put in place stringent measures that will regulate the importation of fish, to avoid landing into the country fish that is of substandard quality or is diseased. This is in the wake of Tilapia Lake Virus outbreak, which has ravaged most East Asian countries.

Zambia has been importing most of her fish from East Asia following shortages of fish in the country.





The plea was made by Aquaculture Development of Zambia chairman, Fisho Mwale, who is also Director on the ZNFU Board during a National Budget Submission meeting in Lusaka on Wednesday 19th July 2017.

"Most fish coming from East Asia is dead cheap, but is diseased fish, throw away fish. Such fish are called rants, but it is finding its way into our market.

"Government is losing billions through these illegal imports, but worse our people are being exposed to health hazards ... there is danger to the health security of our people," Mr. Mwale said.

IMPORTS AFFECTING DAIRY SECTOR GROWTH

The Dairy Association of Zambia (DAZ) says the local industry still faces unfair competition from cheaply imported dairy products that threaten local production and growth.

DAZ economist Kapoche Mwale there is need to create a level playing field by instituting hedging measure. He says this would create a level playing field with imported products. He has also called for close scrutiny of dairy imports.

He bemoans the reduction in dairy exports due to protectionist barriers initiated by some SADC member countries such as Zimbabwe.

He also says the sector suffers from lack of capital investment concessions for processors which discourage investments and limits growth.

Mr. Mwale says DAZ should be given the mandate to regulate issuance of dairy import permits and has called on the introduction of a 25 per cent duty on specified dairy products. And also increase duty on imported milk powder from 5 per cent to 25 per cent, which is meant for further processing.

"All dairy imports to pass through DAZ for scrutiny prior to issuance of import permits. We propose that government introduces 25% export tax on soya cake, molasses, bran, cotton cake and sunflower cake. Milk should be reclassified as a VAT zero rated product, as opposed to its current status of VAT exempt. Government should also eliminate all forms of taxes on dairy equipment and ingredients," Mr. Mwale said.
