#### ZNFU Board holds first meeting after Congress

The Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU) held is first Board Meeting after the 112<sup>th</sup> Annual Congress held on 26<sup>th</sup> October 2017.

The Board discussed a wide range of issues surrounding the ZNFU and other strategies for its growth going forward. The ZNFU is arguably the largest farmers' body in Zambia and the region, which embraces all strata of farmers; small, emergent and large scale.

The Board welcomed new entrant, Maria zaloumis.

## Lake Kariba levels down to 41%

Lake Kariba levels have dropped to 41 per cent.

This is according to the information obtained from the Zambezi River Authority (ZRA) by the Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU).


According to the ZRA the Lake level dropped by 0.13m during the week under review and closed the week at 481.29m on 7<sup>th</sup> November 2017.





Last year on the same date, the Lake level was 478.34m. Lake Kariba was created and designed to operate between levels of 475.50m and 488.50m with 0.70m freeboard at all times.

### CHICOL officially unveils organic Fertiliser

Chicol Estates on Thursday officially unveiled the Chicola Natural Fertilisers after eight years of trails.

The occasion also launched a new company, the Green Valley Fertilisers Zambia Limited, which has been designated to handle the anticipated increased production from the current 5 tonnes per day to between 50 tonnes and 100 tonnes per day once the plant is opened in the MFEZ area early next year.

The Fertilisers has been tried on soya beans, maize, vegetables and lawns and been a huge success. The natural fertiliser has been approved by the Zambia Agriculture Research Institute (ZARI).





Chicol Estates proprietor, and founder of the Chicola Natural Fertilisers, Aaron Chungu says the fertiliser is now ready for uptake. He says the new company, Green Valley Fertilisers Zambia Limited, will be moved from Chicol Estates to MFEZ, to allow for more poultry farmers to be bringing in their chicken droppings, which is the major raw material for the fertilisers, which is processed into small smooth pellets.

He says the cost of putting up the plant will cost about US\$1.5 million. He is buoyant the product is ready for FISP and the general market.

#### ZFEA Wage negotiations extended

Negotiations have begun for the 2017/18 minimum wages but are running behind schedule. This has necessitated the collective bargaining unit to apply to the Labour Commissioner for a six-week extension of the 2016/17 wage agreement which expired on 31 October 2017. Therefore the 2016/17 minimum wages will remain in force until a settlement has been reached.

Category A; land within Lusaka, Copperbelt, Central and Southern Provinces:

Up to 1 hectare = K83.10

Above 1 hectare = K5/ha Cumulative/additional charge

Category B; land within Eastern, Western, Muchinga, North-Western, Luapula and Northern Provinces:

Up to 1 hectare = K83.10

Above 1 hectare = K4/ha Cumulative/additional charge
