# ZESCO TO REDUCE POWER SUPPLY TO NORTHERN PART OF COUNTRY

# ... as upgrade works at Leopards' Hill kick in

Zesco will from 30<sup>th</sup> July to 30<sup>th</sup> August 2018 be replacing the switchgear at its Leopards Hill substation, which development is going to affect transmission capacity from Leopards Hill to the northern part of the country.

According to a communique availed to the Zambia National Farmers Union (ZNFU) by Zesco Limited during the week, the 330kV Kabwe lines 1, 2 and 3 from Leopards Hill substation are earmarked for switchgear replacement.

Zesco says during this period, only two (02) of the three (03) 330kV Leopards Hill – Kabwe lines shall be in service at each time resulting in the transmission capacity between Leopards Hill and Kabwe substations being limited to a total of 700MW.

In view of this, Load management will be implemented in Northern, Copperbelt, North-Western, Luapula, Muchinga, Eastern and parts of Central provinces in order to ensure that the remaining two lines are safely loaded during the entire outage period in order to maintain reliability, safety and security of the Interconnected Power System.

Zesco Limited under the Leopards Hill Switchgear Retrofit Project has been replacing aged primary equipment at its Leopards Hill 330/132/88kV substation in Lusaka.





The project works commenced in 2017 and has seen 80% of the 88kV equipment replaced hence improving the service delivery in the Lusaka Distribution network. The replacement works on the 330kV section of the substation is in progress with all the 330kV Kariba North line bay equipment having been replaced with high rated equipment to support increased generation and demand.

Zesco says it shall ensure that the switchgear replacement project works at Leopards Hill substation are completed within the stipulated period and supply normalized as soon as the works on the third line is completed.

The utility regrets any inconvenience this may cause.

### MUKWATO ELECTED NEW CHAVUMA DFA CHAIRPERSON

Chavuma District Farmers Association successfully held their Annual General Meeting on 25<sup>th</sup> July 2018.

The AGM was well attended with over fifty members coming from different Information Centers. The meeting elected Mr. Teddy Mukwato as the new Chairman after a heavily contested poll, replacing Mr. R. Manjimela.

The meeting was attended by Mr. Peter Maseka, the District Agricultural Coordinator for Chavuma, Mr. Kingsley Nyambe, the NATSAVE Bank Manager and Mrs. Florence Phiri from ZNFU Lusaka.

The Annual General Meeting resolved to concentrate on building the DFA through enhancing membership mobilization and income generation by efficiently managing their rice polishing business.

### ... as Zambezi River water at Chavuma recedes

Lake levels at Kariba have been decreasing during the week after peaking during the season to 486.90 metres.

The week ending 31<sup>st</sup> July 2018 recorded lake levels of 486.74 metres, translating into the lake levels standing at 85% full. This is a reduction by 1%, having been at 86% full during the large part of the month of July.


However, during the same period last year, the Lake level was 482.88 metres of 54% full. This gives comfort to farmers involved in irrigation as guarantees of steady supply of electricity are firmed up.





And water flows on the Zambezi River at Chavuma are in recession closing the week under review at 217 cubic metres per second. Observations last year noted water flows of 124 cubic metres per second, indicating a marked improvement in 2018.
