IN DETAIL ...

FRA MOPS UP 137, 000MTS

With two months before the onset of the rainy season and summer planting period, the Food Reserve Agency (FRA) has bought 137, 000 metric tonnes out of the targeted 500, 000 metric tonnes of maize.

According to information reaching Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU), most of the purchases have been made in the Northern Provinces, but has found challenges buying in Lusaka, Copperbelt, Central, Eastern and Southern Provinces.

The FRA has managed to rake up 43, 000 metric tonnes of maize in Muchinga Province and 33, 000 metric tonnes in Northern Province. The Agency has barely managed to buy maize in Copperbelt, Eastern, Central, Lusaka, Southern and North Western Provinces where they have been supplied 'crumbs' as most farmers have opted for better offers.

The FRA is offering K70 for a 50kg bag of maize while companies such as Zambeef and National Milling are buying spot cash at K92 per 50 kg bag, or alternatively pay the farmers within 24 hours of delivery.

FRA is yet to pay the farmers.

Cross border buyers from Zimbabwe and Malawi are offering as much as K120 per 50kg bag of maize.









FARMERS SEEK CLARIFICATION OVER WARMA CHARGING ON INTERNATIONAL SHARED RIVERS

Farmers are seeking clarification over why the Zambia's Water Resources and Management Authority (WARMA) is demanding complete applications for water rights from farmers that are using water from shared rivers, when the Act states otherwise.

WARMA has been telling some farmers that abstract water from the Zambezi to oblige to payment of fees for water usage as per Statutory Instrument (SI) 18 of 2018 of the Water Resources Management Act, when the same Act also states that "WARMA exercises control over all water resources in Zambia as envisioned in the Water Resources Management Act. The Act set out provisions to regulate the use of water in Zambia by considering or issuing of water permits with the exception of international shared water bodies".

Since some farmers are using international water bodies, such as the Zambezi River, they are now querying why WARMA officers are going against their own Act and pushing farmers to pay user fees.

The Zambezi River is classified as an International Water Body.

There has been no immediate response from WARMA, which organisation has given water users, including farmers, an ultimatum of end month to pay or be penalised and or prosecuted.

The Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU) has maintained that there has been no proper due consultation with the farming community over the water user fees and the SI and a lot of lacunas need addressing.

KWACHA HITS K11 TO US\$1

After holding the K10 to US\$1 cupping for a long period, the Kwacha this week buckled and slid to K11 to the green buck on Tuesday.

By Friday 21st September, the Kwacha had tumbled to K11.70 in most bureaux around Central Business District (CBD) in Lusaka, with speculation that it may continue losing its muscle.

The Zambian Kwacha has also lost grip against the Euro and Pound, among other major currencies.

The British Pound is now fetching K14.50 while the Euro is K12.90 in barely four days from K13.90 and K12 respectively.

2019 BUDGET TO BE UNVEILED NEXT FRIDAY

Winister of Finance Margaret Mwanakatwe will unveil the 2019 National Budget on Friday 28th September 2018, a Ministry of Finance official has said.





Chileshe Kandeta, Ministry of Finance Public Relations Officer, has said the Ministry has been undertaking consultations with stakeholders over the past four months, whose submissions would be captured in the budget presentation.

The 2019 Budget is expected to be above K80 billion. The 2018 national budget was K71.6 million and that for 2017 was K64.5 billion.

INFLUX OF IMPORTED DIARY PRODUCTS KILLING LOCAL SECTOR

The Dairy Association of Zambia (DAZ) says the importation of dairy products, particularly long life milk is negatively affecting growth of the local industry.

DAZ said this during the grant donation of six milk analysers by the Ministry of Commerce Trade and Industry (MCTI) in Lusaka on Thursday.

DAZ said some local processors are forced to dump raw milk because of failing to sell as a result of unfair competition with cheap imports. DAZ said the country has enough capacity to produce long life milk saying this defeats the need to import long life dairy products.

DAZ also said low import duty on milk powder was also a major stumbling block to the local diary sector. Currently the import duty on milk powder, which is used for further processing full cream milk attracts a 5% duty instead of 25%.

DAZ said unfortunately, once processed, the milk powder competes with fresh raw milk. DAZ said this slows down growth and employment creation. DAZ called for the necessary regulation and policy to address what it termed long standing issues.
