NOW FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE BREAKS OUT IN SOUTHERN PROVINCE

Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) has been reported in Monze.

So far more than 20 cattle have been affected around the District. The disease was first reported on Monday 25th February 2019 and has since spread to other areas around the District.

A task force has, however, been instituted as efforts to contain the situation escalate.

The District Task Force is composed of the Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock, Ministry of Agriculture, District commissioner, Police, Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU), Musika, selected farmers and other stakeholders. The committee is chaired by the District Commissioner and sub-committees have been formed to do specific tasks in an effort to arrest the situation.

The District Veterinary Coordinator (DVC) has since reported to the committee that the vaccine for the disease isn't available in Zambia hence the committee lobbying Central government to intervene.

With these efforts the vaccine has been imported and expected to be in Monze over the weekend.

AFGRI ZAMBIA REDUCES DEPOTS, DOWNSCALES EMPLOYMENT

AFGRI has embarked on the process to reduce the number of depots they operate for storage around country, attributing this to the poor financial performance of the agricultural sector in Zambia.

AFGRI Country Manager-Zambia Albre Badenhorst says the downscaling will unfortunately result in job losses.

He says the process of reducing the number of depots will continue as certain identified sites are emptied. Mr. Badenhorst says it is, however, envisaged that other sites will remain open for the foreseeable future.

"In future trading will also only be executed on a mandate and back-to-back basis. The downscaling of the trading operations and the closing of a number of depots will unfortunately result in employment losses," Mr. Badenhorst says.





This is in a communique availed to the Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU) in Lusaka.

He also says as regards AFGRI Leasing Services, providing finance to primary producers, the company is simply not able to secure the correct level of funding required to support local farmers in line with their growth expectations going forward, and accordingly will discontinue operations as of the end of February 2019.

"Our Equipment division is being transferred to a separate legal entity styled AFGRI Equipment Zambia Limited which will bring the structure in line with other countries AFGRI operates in. The operations of the Equipment business (John Deere and other brands) will however not be impacted at all and both our Lusaka and Mkushi branches, and Mpongwe parts depot, remain fully operational," Mr. Badenhorst says.

He also says ABBA, the company's community farming operation as well as CMI International, who manage collateralised commodities on behalf of financial institutions, are not affected by the restructuring process.

He says unfortunately, the above process of restructuring their operations has given rise to a number of resignations, but AFGRI would like to assure their clients that contingency plans are already in place to ensure that suitable replacements are sourced swiftly.

DRY SPELL HITS SOUTHERN, WESTERN AND CENTRAL PROVINCES

Droughts have been reported in most southern parts of the country as the El Nino digs in.

In Southern province; Monze, Chisekesi, Pemba, Choma and most parts of Western Province are experiencing lack of precipitation.

In Monze, the last rains were experienced on 17th January 2019.

In Central province, Chongwe and Rufunsa and some parts of Chibombo are among some districts affected by drought during February resulting in serious wilting of crops.

IRISH AID/ MUSIKA ENDORSE NUTRITION PROJECT

Over 40,000 smallholder farmers are set to benefit from a € 5.5 million Nutrition project implemented by Musika with funding from Irish Aid, through the Embassy of Ireland in Zambia.

The 'Making Agricultural Markets work for Nutrition' project aims to achieve an increased consumption of a diverse range of nutritious foods among poor households, especially amongst women and children, and within smallholder farming and rural communities.





The Irish Aid funding will allow Musika to implement various interventions focusing on strengthening the supply chain of nutritious food products, by facilitating beneficial commercial relationships between actors along the supply chain from input suppliers and smallholder farmers to processors and retailers. The project also has a focus on supporting the food processing sector to develop affordable nutritious foods and associated distribution channels into the rural food retail market. It will be implemented countrywide, but with 'case study' districts of Mongu, Mumbwa, Kabwe and Mazabuka over a period of five years.

According to Musika Head of Corporate Affairs Pamela Hamasaka, Musika will concentrate its activities across the whole supply chain (from input, services, research and technology markets through production, processing and distribution) for three key agricultural sectors - legumes, fresh fruit and vegetables, livestock and livestock products - that can play a fundamental role in the expansion of the nutritious foods market.

ZRA CONDUCTS SENSITISATION ON BUDGET CHANGES FOR THE CHARGE YEAR 2019

The Zambia Revenue Authority (ZRA) this week conducted a sensitisation meeting on the 2019 budget changes with business entities in the tourist capital, Livingstone.

The main purpose of the meeting was to inspire public confidence and foster compliance to the public by registration, submission of returns, declaration of correct tax and payment of returns.

ZRA informed the meeting that the key domestic taxes changes that would be effected in 2019 were as follows:

- Repeal provision which allowed for the deduction of mineral royalty in ascertaining the gains or profits of a business
- Broadening of the scope of documentation and or information to be kept in the English by taxpayer from 6 years to 10 years for related parties
- Empowering of the commissioner general to appoint any person as an agent to withhold turnover tax on payments to suppliers of goods and services
- Introduction of a flat rate of 4%for turnover
- Increased penalty fee for non compliance with transfer pricing regulations to 24,000,000 from 3,000
- Applicable tax rate is 10% for income arising from the export of non traditional products from farming or Afro processing
- Introduction of a tax rate of 15% on income earned by a company from the manufacturing of products using copper cathodes
- Extend the period within which the commissioner general may arise an





to 10years from 6years in the case of a business transaction with associated persons

- Increase withholding tax rate to 20% from 15% on any payment of dividends to a non-resident
- Increase the withholding taxpayer to 20% from 15% on any payment of interest to a non-resident.

The meeting was organized by Mrs violet Mulubwa from the ZRA integrity committee in Lusaka.




