HARVEST DAY; MUMBWA CALLS

Mumbwa Town in Central Zambia will host the 2018/2019 Harvest Day on 3rd July 2019.

To be graced by the President of the Republic of Zambia Mr. Edgar Chagwa Lungu, the Harvest Day is expected to attract senior government officials, Royal Highnesses, security personnel and over 500 farmers.

The Harvest Day will be held at enterprising award winning emergent farmer Mr. Wisdom Mababe's farm starting 09:00 hours.

The Harvest Day has been organised by the Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU), together with Pannar/Pioneer Seed.

GOVT. SETS ASIDE USD23.7M FOR AQUACULTURE

Government has taken steps to address the country's annual fish deficit by setting aside a seed fund for aquaculture development, which stands at a staggering US\$23.7 million.

Minister of Fisheries and Livestock Mrs. Kampamba Mulenga Chewe said during a press briefing on Thursday 27th June 2019 that government, with support from the African Development Bank (ADB) is developing the Aquaculture Enterprise Development Project, which aims at contributing to economic growth as well as enhancing food and nutrition security in Zambia.

She disclosed that already over 23, 000 farmers have applied for the Aquaculture Development Fund whose applications are currently being evaluated. She said government has since appointed the Citizens Economic Empowerment Commission (CEEC) to manage the seed Fund.

She said currently Zambia has an annual fish deficit of about 87, 000 metric tonnes, which should urgently be reversed and instead turn the country into a net exporter of fish.

Mrs. Mulenga-Chewe said in accordance with the Presidential directive to boost growth in fish production, her Ministry has positioned the Aquaculture Seed Fund to be the main response.

She said through increased fish production under the Aquaculture Seed Fund, government is determined to eliminate annual fish deficit within the next four years with the ultimate objective of transforming Zambia into a net exporter of fish.

CHIPATA-LUNDAZI ROAD IN DEPLORABLE STATE

The Chipata-Lundazi road has deteriorated to dangerous levels with the stretch between Lundazi turn off through to Mwasempangwe needing a major facelift.

A Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU) staffer recently travelled to Lundazi and sentiments among farmers and general travellers are that the road should be worked on as matter of urgency before lives are lost.

Farmers said it has become increasingly difficult to transport their produce on this road as it takes languaged usual to move their commodities.

Some said they are incurring huge costs to repair their vehicles as wear and tear is taking a





Lundazi has over the years become a major producer of maize, soyabeans, sunflower, tobacco, groundnuts and cotton; but transportation of the commodities has become a challenge due to the state of disrepair that the road is in.

DOWN TO 28% FULL ...

Water troubles have continued at Lake Kariba with water levels continuing to drop on a weekly basis.

According to information obtained from the Zambezi River Authority (ZRA), the Lake level continued receding, dropping by 10cm during the week under review, before closing at 479.48m (28% usable storage) on 27^{th} June 2019.

The Lake levels have not peaked after the rains subsided early April. It takes about three months for waters to start collecting and building up in the Lakes and other water reservoirs that feed from rivers.

The Kariba Lake is designed to operate between levels 475.50m and 488.50m (with 0.70m freeboard) for hydropower generation. Last year on the same date, the Lake level was 486.84m










KARIBA RESERVOIR Comparison of Daily Reservoir Levels

WEATHER

SEVEN DAYS WEATHER FORECAST FROM 29th JUNE TO 5th JULY 2019

GENERAL SITUATION

From 29th June to 2nd July 2019, relatively moist airflow from the east will be affecting most parts of Zambia resulting into slightly windy and partly cloudy weather conditions over the eastern parts of the country, while the rest of the country will be mainly sunny.

From 3 rd to the end of the forecast period relatively moist, moderate and cool airflow from the southeast will start affecting most parts of the country leading to cloudy and windy weather conditions.

DETAILED FORECAST: 29TH JUNE TO 2ND JULY 2019

Muchinga, Eastern, and eastern districts of Lusaka and Central provinces: Mainly sunny slightly windy and mild at first, becoming partly cloudy by mid-mornings, the afternoons will be warm to hot. Nights are expected to be mainly clear and mild tending to be cool by dawn. Southern, Western, Northwestern, Copperbelt, Luapula, Northern and western districts of Lusaka and Central provinces: Sunny, slightly windy and mild in the mornings, developing few clouds and warm to hot in the afternoons. It will be cool to cold in the night with clear skies.

DETAILED FORECAST: 3RD TO 5 TH JULY 2019

Luapula, Northern, Muchinga, Eastern, Central and Lusaka Provinces: Partly cloudy, windy at times and cool to mild in the mornings, becoming cloudy and warm in the afternoons. The nights will be partly cloudy, windy at times and mild to cool. Southern, Western, Northwestern and Copperbelt Provinces: Mainly sunny, windy at times and cool to mild in the mornings, becoming partly cloudy and warm in the afternoons. The nights will be mainly clear, windy at times and mild to cool.
