## WATER FLOWS INTO ZAMBEZI RIVER RISE

Water flows at two strategic telemetry stations on the Kariba Catchment indicate a steady increase of water which will feed into the Kariba Dam, the Zambezi River Authority (ZRA) can state.

During a press briefing held Friday 7<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the ZRA said key telemetry stations on the Zambezi River; the Victoria Falls station and the Chavuma station show improved water flows. Chavuma and Victoria Falls are key indicators of the performance of the mainstream Zambezi River that contributes 75% of inflows into Lake Kariba.

The ZRA said throughout the first week of February, the Zambezi River flow at Victoria Falls has continued to rise quite steadily, rising above last year's flows during the same period by 25%, though still below the long-term average of 29%.

The Authority said at Chavuma, the flows shot up by 73 m3/second between 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> February 2020 indicating intense run-offs on the Zambezi headwaters.

ZRA said: "The flow is still soaring above the long-term average by 41% and last year's flows by 189%. The flows have also far exceeded those of 2014/2015 at the same time giving a ray of hope for better run-off at this station this year than both last year and 2014/2015."

#### ZATP LAUNCHES MARKET CONNECT IN LIVINGSTONE

The Ministry of Commerce, Trade and Industry (MCTI) through the Zambia Agribusiness and Trade Project (ZATP) on Tuesday launched the MARKET CONNECT project which aims to promote the sustainable integration of Agribusiness SMEs into value chains with established end markets and large buyers.

This initiative will enable Agribusiness based enterprises in Livingstone to grow their businesses. James Chiwala, the Business Development Manager from ZATP Lusaka, officiated at the event.

The MARKET CONNECT project will be funded by the World Bank.

The meeting was held at Limbo Lodge.









## MBALA FARMERS ADVISED TO TAKE LIVESTOCK AS A BUSINESS

Mbala District fisheries and livestock coordinator Dr Stephen Tembo has encouraged farmers to take livestock as a business and not just as a culture.

Dr Tembo says most farmers in the District do not care about the East Coast Fever (ECF) popularly known as "imbuli". He also said that ECF can be controlled by spraying or dipping of cattle and that the method is cheaper than treatment. He said the ECF is not an outbreak and does not spread but that it can be controlled by farmers.

Dr Tembo advised livestock farmers to be keeping more cows than oxen if they are to grow their cattle herds. This came to light during the awareness meeting in the District.

### FARMERS THANK GOVT FOR DISTRIBUTING FIELD CHEMICALS

Government through the Ministry of Agriculture (MoA) has been commended for purchasing and distribution of pesticides to farmers whose field crops have been attacked by Fall Army Worms (FAW).

Lucheche camp committee chairperson Simon Mitimingi says the gesture is commendable saying the chemicals will go a long way in containing the FAW and stock borer in their maize fields.

Mr. Mitimingi encouraged fellow farmers to follow the instructions given by the extension officers when spraying the fields.

# **INDUSTRY UPDATES**

## SOYA MEAL EXPORTS DROP BY \$35M

Low demand for Zambian soya meal by Zimbabwe resulted in the country recording a significant reduction in exports in 2019 by US\$35 million from earning US\$68 million in 2018.

This represented a 50 percent reduction in export earnings among soya meal crushers.

# THE SEVEN DAY WEATHER FORECAST FOR THE PERIOD FROM 8<sup>TH</sup> TO 14<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2020

#### **GENERAL SITUATION**

From 8th to 12th February 2020, the Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (I.T.C.Z) will be oscillating about the southern borders of Zambia coupled with the subtropical trough (Low pressure system) extending from North West part of Zambia to South-East coast of South Africa will be responsible for rainfall activities over most parts of the country. This sub-tropical trough will be enhancing rainfall activities as it moves from the western to the eastern parts of Zambia. From 13th to the end of the forecast period only the I.T.C.Z will be responsible for the rainfall activities across the country has it continues oscillating about the southern borders of Zambia.

DETAILED FORECAST: 8th to 12th February 2020

Lusaka, Southern, Western, Central, Eastern, Northwestern, Copperbelt, Muchinga including the southern parts of Luapula, Northern and Muchinga provinces: Cloudy with morning rain, the afternoons will be mainly cloudy with rain and thunder. The nights will be mostly cloudy with isolated rain.

The northern parts of Luapula, Northern and Muchinga provinces: The morning will be partly cloudy becoming cloudy by late morning. The afternoons will be mainly cloudy with showers and thunderstorms. The nights will be partly cloudy with a chance of rain.

DETAILED FORECAST: 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> February 2020 The whole country: Mainly cloudy with outbreaks of rain.

#### **ADVISORY**

Possible heavy falls and flash floods risk areas that models are projecting during the forecast period: Western, Southern, Lusaka, Central and southern parts of Eastern Province.
