CORRIDOR DISEASE HITS CHIBOMBO

Chibombo farmers have been affected by the rise in corridor diseases cases.

Cattle has continued to die in the area due to lack of dipping facilities and irregular spraying of animals by farmers. The veterinary office in Chibombo confirmed the presence of the disease and sensitization meetings are ongoing.

This came to light when ZNFU stuff visited some Information Centres (ICs) among them Shimukuni, Lwamabwe and Muchinga and got reports and cases of affected animals. Awareness meetings are being conducted by both the Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock and ZNFU to sensitize the farmers on the control and preventive measures.

Farmers are being advised to spray their animals regularly by using paverxion plus and oxject. Farmers thanked ZNFU and the ministry for the technical advice and sensitization meetings which are aimed at combating the disease.

Farmers, however, complained about the high cost of vaccines for the disease as a reason for irregular spraying.

YOUTHS URGED TO EMBRACE FARMING AS A BUSINESS

Youths in Chongwe district have been told to embrace farming as it has power to better their personal wellbeing and improve their livelihoods.

Speaking during the Youth Day celebrations; different leaders from the church and other civil society encouraged youths to embrace farming from their young age as it was the future for the country.

The youths were also encouraged to form co-operatives and work together with other youths. Chongwe already boasts of a few youth co-operatives that are already doing value addition to agricultural products like the Tweende young farmers' co-operative of Chongwe district who were also present during the youth day celebrations.

MUBENDE IC HOLDS FIELD DAY FOR RICE PRODUCTION

Mubende IC held its field day on 10th March 2020.

The IC has cultivated two rice varieties namely, Nerica and Super rice. The two varieties are being promoted by JICA with the purpose of promoting food crop diversification focusing on rice production.

The field day was attended by the district officers from the Ministry of Agriculture and other stakeholders such as the ZNFU within the district.





Speaking during the meeting Mr. Isaac Mumpeta who is the acting District Agriculture Coordinating Officer (DACO) for Mwense district said that about 500 hectares of rice have been cultivated during 2019/2020 farming season in Mwense district. Mwense is one of the high potential districts in Luapula province where rice production is concerned.

Farmers in Lucheche Camp in Mbala have been trained in financial literacy by World Vision.

The aim of the training was to equip farmers with knowledge on how to be focused, save and being frugal with their had earned money and reinvesting their money in activities that will enhance production and productivity.

WATER LEVELS INCREASE ... TIMIDLY

Water levels on Lake Kariba have continued to rise diffidently, notching up to 11.83% of usable water during the under review.

According to information obtained from the Zambezi River Authority, Lake Kariba closed the period under review at 477.21m (11.83% usable storage) on 11th March 2020. Last year on the same date, the Lake level was 481.06m (39.69% usable storage).

The Zambezi River Authority said the Lake level has continued rising steadily and remained relatively stable towards the end of the reporting period.

THE SEVEN DAY WEATHER FORECAST FOR THE PERIOD FROM 14^{TH} to 20^{TH} march 2020

GENERAL SITUATION

From 14th to 19th March 2020, moist and unstable airflow from the northeast will be affecting the northern half of Zambia leading to cloudy weather conditions with rainfall





activities. On the other hand, moderate and stable airflow from the southeast will be influencing weather over the southern half of the country resulting into isolated rainfall activities.

On 20th March 2020, moist and unstable airflow from the northeast will be inducing rainfall activities over most parts of Zambia.

DETAILED FORECAST: 14th to 19th March 2020

Northwestern, Copperbelt, Luapula, Northern and Muchinga Provinces: Mainly cloudy with a chance of morning rain. The afternoons will be mainly cloudy with showers and thunderstorms. The nights will be partly cloudy with a chance of rain.

Western, Southern, Lusaka, Central and Eastern Provinces: Partly cloudy in the morning. The afternoons will be mostly cloudy with a chance of isolated showers. The nights will be mainly clear.

DETAILED FORECAST: 20th March 2020

Most parts of Zambia: Mostly cloudy in the mornings with a chance of rain. The afternoons will be mainly cloudy with isolated showers and thunderstorms. The nights will be partly cloudy with a chance of rain.

ADVISORY: Possible areas expected to experience heavy falls during the forecast period are Mansa, Mwense, Chipili, Kawambwa, Mwinilunga, Solwezi, Mpika, Kaputa, Nchelenge, Chiengi, Samfya, Kasama, Chinsali and Chama.
