Prices of chicken, beef and stockfeeds continue to increase and may be attributable to the cost of production (procurement cost of raw materials and other inputs) and the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak and containment measures. The latter, as well as uncertainty and a reduction in overall efficiency of production and operations, brought about a significant decline in sales as movement of consumers was restricted.

By the end of the month, stockholding had declined from its peak during the second and third week of April due to a cut back in production necessitated by slow sales and limited storage capacity.

Placings for Day-old Chicks were also affected as orders could not be collected and distribution agents took smaller batches from breeders and hatchers. As a result, a significant number of chicks were destroyed.
