COVID-19 STALLS KGL COMMISSIONING

Commissioning of the Kafue Gorge Lower (KGL) could stall as the second wave of COVID-19 continues to devastate programs across all sectors of the economy.

Zesco Limited intimated during the ZNFU/Zesco Committee meeting held Thursday 14th January 2021 via ZOOM, that commissioning of the much anticipated KGL has been affected by COVID 19 as movement of strategic personnel has been restricted.

The power utility said while work on the KGL is taking place, projected timelines have been affected.

The plant reached 72% completion in early 2020, with the first unit having been expected to have been commissioned in the fourth quarter of 2020, while the other units were projected to be commissioned in phases.

Housing five 150MW generator units, the project includes the construction of a 139 metre-high concrete-face rock-fill dam (CFRD) with a crest width between 8 metres and 10 metres and a length of approximately 378 metres. It also includes a surface powerhouse with a width of 44.5 metres, a height of 58m and a length of 127m.

Zesco said load shedding is expected to reduce as KGL commissions units, which target has now been set to commence in February 2021.

ANTI-SMUGGLING: ZRA TO REINFORCE DRONE USAGE

The Zambia Revenue Authority (ZRA) says it will strengthen the anti-smuggling unit to ensure that the authority smoothers all forms of the illegal trade as this has been robbing the country of billions of Kwacha in lost earnings.

ZRA Commissioner General Kingsley Chanda said during his Annual Press Conference at Taj Pamodzi Hotel on 13th JANUARY 2021, that the Authority will reinforce its antismuggling operations by working closely with other security wings and also by rolling out usage of drones to enhance aerial patrols.

He said the usage of new technology, through drones, has helped curb smuggling because the equipment is able to traverse difficult terrain where smuggling has been rampant.

He disclosed that last year alone, the anti-smuggling unit managed to save the country some K35.2 billion through its vigilant systems.

ZRA first conducted test flights for drones on 17th August 2019 and managed to impound seven (7) trucks, which illegal traders used to move undeclared cargo in Kapiri Mposhi. More s**achoperation**s were conducted during the course of 2020.





KARIBA LEVELS UPSURGE CONTINUES

The Lake level Kariba has continued to increase with increasing inflows from the Zambezi River and immediate Kariba Lower Catchment, thus closing at 478.50 metres or 20.93% of usable storage on 14th January 2021. This is over and above the 476.62 metres or 7.77% of usable storage recorded on the same date in the year 2020.

This is according to a report obtained from Zambia Revenue Authority (ZRA), Friday.

The ZRA has allocated Zambia's Kariba North Bank and Kariba North Bank Extension some 15,000 Bm³ of water, which translates into an equivalent of 391MW of average generation.



KARIBA RESERVOIR


Comparison of Daily Reservoir Levels







ZNFU MOURNS COTTON CHIEF







The Zambia National Farmers' Union (ZNFU) is at a loss over the death of Cotton Association of Zambia (CAZ) Executive Director Joseph Nkole.

Mr. Nkole, who was also Vice President of the African Cotton and Textiles Industries Federation (ACTIF) died at the age of 67 at Levy Mwanawasa Hospital in Lusaka after a short illness.

His death was announced by his daughter Chileshe in a statement issued on Friday 8th January 2021.

Mr. Nkole had been on life support machine since Monday 4th January 2021.

Apart from leading the CAZ, an association under the ZNFU ambits, Mr. Nkole once also served as president of the Referees Association of Zambia (RAZ) and as the Football Association of Zambia (FAZ) executive committee member.

At the time of his untimely death, Mr. Nkole was among the three candidates in the race for the FAZ top job alongside Mr. Andrew Kamanga and Mr. Emmanuel Munaile.

Mr. Nkole was put to rest on Wednesday 13th January 2021.
